ROCK IN FAIRWAY OFF HEATH POINT, NORMANBY SOUND.

THE Harbor Master at Thursday Island reports the existence of a rocky patch 150 feet long and 50 feet broad, with not more than 13 feet at low water on the shallowest part—which appears to be a pinnacle rock—with foul bottom all round it and a strong tide rip. Compass bearings from shallowest part are as follow:—
