WHEREAS by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature, it is made lawful for the Governor of the Colony of Western Australia for the time being, to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; Now THEREFORE I, Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, K.C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA shall commence and be holden for the despatch of business on MONDAY, THE NINETEENTH DAY OF JULY, 1880, at two o'clock in the afternoon, in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, within the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

ROCK IN FAIRWAY OFF HEATH POINT,
NORMANBY SOUND.

THE Harbor Master at Thursday Island reports the existence of a rocky patch 150 feet long and 50 feet broad, with not more than 13 feet at low water on the shallowest part—which appears to be a pinnacle rock—with foul bottom all round it and a strong tide rip.
