"HEREAS by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature, it is made lawful for the Governor of the Colony of Western Australia for the time being, to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; Now THEREFORE I, Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, K.C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a Session OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA shall commence and be holden for the despatch of business on MONDAY, THE NINETEENTH DAY OF JULY, 1880, at two o'clock in the afternoon, in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, within the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

#### Perth Poor House, 28th June, 1880.

28th June, 1880. SIE,—I have the honor to report having on the 28th of May visited and inspected the Perth Protestant Orphanage for Girls. Number of Government inmates, 23; private, 2; total number, 25. They were clean, healthy looking, and neatly clothed. There has been no sickness amongst the children during the past quarter, and their conduct continues good. The food supplied them is good, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated. The children attend school, which is conducted on the premises.

The same day I visited and inspected the Native and Half-Caste Mission, Perth. Number of boys, 8; girls, 13; total number, 21. They were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking. Their conduct continues good. The food supplied them is good in quality, and they are not stinted. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated.

were clean and well ventilated. The same day I visited and inspected the R. C. Orphanage for Girls. Number of Government inmates, 56; maintained by private funds, 13; total number, 69. The children were clean, healthy looking, and neatly clothed. There has been no sickness amongst the children during the past quarter, and their conduct continues good. The food supplied them is good in quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants. The children attend school, which is conducted on the premises. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated.

The same day I visited and inspected the R. C. Orphanage for Boys at Subiaco. Number of Government inmates, 42; maintained by private funds, 19; total number 61. They were clean, healthy looking, and neatly clothed. There has been no sickness amongst the children during the past quarter, and their conduct continues good. The food supplied them is good in quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants. The children attend school, which is conducted on the premises. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated.

June 17th.—Visited and inspected the Swan P. Orphanage for Boys. Number of Government inmates, 35; maintained by private funds, 3; total number, 85. The boys were clean, healthy looking, and neatly clothed. A case of sickness occurred in May, which terminated fatally; with this one exception the health of the children has been good. There were no complaints as to their conduct during the past quarter. The food supplied to them is good in quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants. The children attend school, which is conducted on the premises. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated. The water supply at each Institution is good.

# GUANO.

# Houtman's Rocks near Champion Bay,

# and Islands in Sharks Bay.

THE Government of Western Australia invites tenders from persons desirous of obtaining the right to remove Guano from the group of Islands known as Houtman's Rocks, and from the Islands in Sharks Bay. Such tenders must be sent in to the Surveyor General, Perth, Western Australia, on or before the 1st October next, but the Government does not bind itself to accept the highest or any tender.

2. Tenders may be made for all the Guano on the Islands in Sharks Bay, and on the Islands forming the group called Houtman's Rocks, together or separately, and may specify for a lump sum to be paid in advance annually, for the right to remove some given quantity within a time to be agreed upon.

3. The Contractor will be required, within twenty-one days after receiving a notification that his tender is accepted, and before the issue of any license, to deposit in the hands of the Western Australian Government ten per cent. on the value tendered for, as security for the due performance of the contract, and this sum will be retained by the Government until the termination of the contract. The Contractor will at no time be at liberty to remove any Guano unless the royalty agreed upon has been paid.

4. All the vessels employed must be provided with a license issued under the authority of the Colonial Act 40th Victoria, No. 9, and such may be obtained through the Collector of Customs at Fremantle, or the Government Resident at Geraldton.

5. The contractor will be at liberty to erect on any or all of the islands any buildings, jetties, tramways, &c., and, subject to the conditions hereinafter expressed as to forfeiture, to remove the same at any time within six months of the termination of the contract.

The contract to be entered into in pursuance of this notice shall be deemed to commence on the date of acceptance of tender.

6. Each tender, unless otherwise expressed, shall be deemed to be open to acceptance by the Government for the space of fourteen days from the 1st October; and the Government shall be at liberty to accept any tender by notifying to the person making it, by telegraph, that his tender is accepted. Any person who shall tender, and, on his tender being accepted, shall fail to deposit the ten per cent. as hereinbefore set forth in paragraph 3, shall be deemed to have broken his contract, and the Government shall thereupon be at liberty to accept any other tender, and to hold such person responsible for all loss consequent on his breach of contract.

7. Tenders will also be received for the removal of Guano, on payment of royalties to be calculated as under :---

The quantity of Guano taken by each ship on which royalty has to be paid shall be ascertained by adding 25 per cent. to the registered tonnage of timber built ships, and 40 per cent. to the registered tonnage of iron built ships; provided that, if the captain or agent of any ship, or the Government, shall in any instance be dissatisfied with the foregoing arrangement, the ship shall be exactly measured according to Lloyds', and the number of cubical feet so ascertained divided by 40 shall be taken to be the tonnage capacity of the ship.

8. The attached Reports give the information in the possession of Government respecting the islands alluded to in this notice, but no guarantee will be given as to the quantity or quality of the Guano existing on either or any of the islands alluded to, and the beds of Guano shall be worked in a regular and systematic manner, in accordance with instructions that may from time to time be issued by the Government. All Guano removed will be at the contractor's risk after payment of the royalty agreed upon.

9. In case of any breach of the conditions mutually agreed upon the contract or contracts will be deemed to be at an end, and the agreement null and void, and any money paid, on account of licenses or otherwise, forfeited, and in such case the Government reserves the right of taking such proceedings against the contractor as the law provides.

10. Further particulars can be obtained, and charts of the islands seen, at the Survey Office, Perth, at the Customs House, Fremantle, or at the Office of the Government Resident at Geraldton.

Report on Houtman's Rocks, by Capt. W. E. Archdeacon, R.N., Admiralty Surveyor:---

The chart of the "Houtman Rock" and sailing directions referring thereto, published by the Admiralty, are so explicit as to enable the cautious mariner to approach and enter the anchorages with implicit confidence.

The anchorages thoroughly surveyed were Recruit and Good Friday Bays and Batavia Roads.

The two former are perfectly accessible and safe at all seasons.

The space in Recruit Bay is, however, very limited; that in Good Friday Bay is very commodious and suitable for vessels of any draft.

Batavia Roads can only be used as a temporary anchorage, and to load Guano from South end of Pelsart Island or from islets in its vicinity the vessels would have to anchor inside "Pelsart Lagoon" (or the space between Mangrove and Square Islets), from which anchorage the Guano deposits appear to be some five miles distant; cargo boats or other small craft could, however, work at all seasons between the anchorage and adjacent islets, the outer and continuous reefs rendering perfect protection from any sea.

The chart and sailing directions compiled from the surveys of two of the ablest surveyors in H.M. Service should be sufficient to satisfy Lloyds' Agent, or any careful shipmaster, as to safety of these anchorages.

The opinion of the Government Resident, Champion Bay, is that:---

The Admiralty Chart of the Houtman's Rocks is so clear that a Master ought to have no difficulty in taking his vessel by it in any part of the Group. Report on samples of Guano from Houtman's Rocks, by Mr. William Johnson, Government Analytical Chemist, Melbourne:----
