PROCLAMATION

THEREAS by a Deed Poll of Grant bearing date the 13th day of December, 1842, under the hand of the Governor and the Public Seal of the Colony, the Wellington Location No. 41 was granted to Sir James Stirling, and whereas by the said Deed Poll power was reserved to the Crown to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said land which it might at any time by the Crown be deemed necessary to resume for making roads, canals, bridges, towing paths, or other works of public utility or convenience: and whereas the piece or parcel of Land hereinafter described is necessary for the purpose of making a Public Road, and the said piece or parcel of Land has been resumed accordingly; Now know we that Her Most Gracious Majesty doth hereby and by virtue of the said power and authority reserved and contained in the said recited Deed Poll resume, for the purpose aforesaid, all that piece or parcel of Land in the Wellington District, containing about $1\frac{1}{2}$ acres more or less, being such part of Location 41 as is bounded on the Southward by a line starting from a spot on the Western boundary of Location 41 situate 35 chains 59 links in a Southerly direction from its North-West corner and extending 15 chains 20 links in direction N. 81° 58′ E. to the Public Road from Minninup to Bunbury; on the Northward by a line parallel to and at the distance of one chain North from the Southern boundary; on

the East by the Minninup and Bunbury Road aforesaid, and on the West by Quarry Reserve 464 A. All measurements more or less, as shown on the authenticated plan in the office of the Surveyor General, Perth.

NORTH FREMANTLE BRIDGE.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 19th July, 1880.

IS Excellency the Governor, in Executive Council, has been pleased, by virtue of "The Jetties Regulation Act, 1878," 42nd Victoria, No. 18, to frame the undermentioned Regulations for the management and use of the Public Bridge at Fremantle, heretofore known as "The North Fremantle Bridge," and to direct the publication thereof in the Government Gazette:—

- 1. No person shall drive, or cause or permit to be driven, any wheeled vehicle, or shall ride, or drive, or cause to be ridden or driven, any horse or any neat cattle, whether attached to a wheeled vehicle or not, upon or over the said Bridge, faster than at a walking pace.
- 2. No person shall drive, or cause or permit to be driven upon or over the said Bridge, any wheeled vehicle, which with the animals drawing it and its load exceeds the actual or estimated weight of six tons.

- 3. No person shall permit any horses or neat cattle, exceeding six in number, not attached to a wheeled vehicle, to be at one time upon the said Bridge, between the hours of sunrise and sunset.
- 4. No person shall at any time fish from or near the roadway of the said Bridge.

Note.—Every person who shall violate any of the above Regulations will incur a penalty not exceeding £20.
