#### FINDING.

The Court being of opinion that the total loss of the Brig "May Flower" was owing to the default of the Master, William B. Walker, in anchoring the said vessel too near the shore, at Flinder's Bay; and after carefully considering the evidence, hereby adjudge that the Certificate of Competency, No. 12603, of the said William B. Walker, be suspended for the space of six months, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor.
