THE following Regulations prescribed by the Resident Magistrate, Bunbury, for the keeping, dispensing, and selling of Poisons in the town of Bunbury, and the District of Wellington, are published for general information.

#### The Poison Sale Act, 1879.

43 Victoria, No. 14.

REGULATIONS as to keeping, dispensing, and selling of Poisons, in the town of Bunbury and the District

Whereas "The Poison Sale Act, 1879," enacts that the undermentioned articles, viz.:-

Arsenic and its preparations,

Prussic Acid.

Cyanides of Potassium and all Metallic Cyanides, Strychnine and all poisonous vegetable alkaloids and their salts,

Aconite and its preparations,

Emetic Tartar,

Corrosive Sublimate,

Cantharides,

Savin and its Oil,

Ergot of Rye and its preparations,

shall be deemed Poisons within the meaning of the said Act;

That a person selling such Poison shall be licensed by the Resident Magistrate of his District;

That he shall observe all the Regulations respecting the sale of Poison, as specified in section 3; and that he shall conform to such further Regulations as to keeping, dispensing, and selling of such Poison as may from time to time be prescribed by the Resident Magistrate of his District:

Notice is hereby given that the following Regulations will be enforced in the Town of Bunbury and

- the District of Wellington.

  1. The book required by section 3 to be kept for the purpose of making entries therein of the sale of Poison shall at all times be available for inspection by any Justice of the Peace, Police Constable, or other Peace Officer.
  - 2. None of such Poisons shall be sold, or disposed of, or be given at any time to any person under the apparent age of twenty-one years, or in a state of intoxication, nor to any convict or ticket-of-leave holder, aboriginal
  - native, or half-caste native.

    3. No person shall keep any of such Poisons for sale, by retail, in any shop, house of business, or other place, without labelling each box, vessel, wrapper, or cover which may contain such Poisons with the word "Poison."

When Beef is issued, fore and hind quarters, or portions thereof, are to be delivered alternately; six inches at least to be cut off the hough and neck bones. Mutton to be delivered in carcasses, excluding heads, necks, shanks below the knee, and hough joints.

The ordinary ration of Vegetables to consist of 1lb. of Potatoes; but when demanded by the Government, and in season, the following equivalents must be supplied twice a week: Pumpkins, 2lbs.; or Turnips, Carrots, or Cabbage, 1½lb.; or Onions, ¼lb., for every pound of Potatoes.

All supplies must be delivered in good and sound packages; Corn and Flour sacks, and Oil casks, will be returned to the Contractors; other packages will be retained free of charge.

The Contractors will be liable for any expense which may be incurred by the Government in consequence of the non-performance of their contracts.

Payments to be made monthly, and for general supplies for the quantities actually consumed in the month.

No Transfer of any Contract will be permitted, without the previous consent of the Government.

Each Tender must bear the bonâ fide signatures of two responsible and approved sureties, who will be required to be bound for the due performance of the Contract, under a penalty of about one-fourth of the estimated sum to be paid under each Contract.
