T is hereby notified, for general information, that, in pursuance of the following correspondence, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to appoint the under-named gentlemen to be a Board of Advice to assist the Government in administering the provisions of "The Scab Act, 1879" (43rd Vict., No. 16):—

AT a meeting held on the 14th July, consisting of Messrs. Brown, L. Burges, S. Burges, T. Hooley, T. Burges, M. Grant, S. Burt, Jas. G. Lee Steere, and S. H. Parker, to consider the working of the present Scab Act, and what amendments were required,

Mr. Steere having been voted to the chair, It was proposed by Mr. Hooley, seconded by Mr. M. Brown—"That in the opinion of this meeting it is desirable that the provisions of the Scab in Sheep Act should be administered by a Board, appointed by the Governor for that purpose. That no Inspector should be appointed or removed from his office without a recommendation from such Board; and that it is desirable, before any fines imposed upon persons for infringing the Act shall be remitted, the Board should have an opportunity of expressing its opinion to the Governor as to the desirability or otherwise of such remission. That the majority of such Board should consist of men experienced in the management of sheep."

Carried unanimously.

Proposed by Mr. S. Burges, and carried—"That Clause 40 be repealed, and the following be enacted in lieu thereof:—

"'All penalties under this Act shall be recovered in a summary way before a Resident Magistrate and one other Justice, or before any other two Justices, on the complaint of an Inspector. And such penalties shall, so far as may be required, be applied towards carrying out the purposes of the Act; but the same may, to the extent of one moiety, be paid and applied to the informer or complainant, as the Governor, with the advice of the Board, may direct.'"

Sec. 31 requires amending by inserting "not exceeding" before the words "Two pounds," in line 5.

If the Board is appointed as recommended, Section 37 ought to be repealed or amended, so as to give the Board the powers which are therein conferred upon the Governor, and in all other parts of the Act where anything is required to be done by the Governor it should be added "with the advice of the Board."

DEAR SIR,—I have carefully considered the question brought to my notice yesterday, in connection with the working of the Scab Act, by the Committee of which you were Chairman.

I cannot concur in the proposal that no Inspector should be appointed or removed from Office without a recommendation from the Board which you wish to see established. At the same time I quite agree that the advice of persons experienced in the management of sheep would be useful to the Government in carrying out the law, and I am prepared to appoint such a Board of Advice. The plan I would propose is, that the Inspectors' Reports should, on receipt, be immediately forwarded to the Board from the Colonial Secretary's Office, so as to afford the Board an opportunity of expressing their views to the Government, without delay, on any points requiring attention; and while I cannot consent to legalize the principle proposed in your first resolution, the practical working of the plan I suggest would be

that the Board would advise the Governor on all matters connected with the Ordinance, whether personal to the Inspectors or otherwise. Reports from the Magistrates, records of convictions, etc., and all correspondence connected with the Act, would be sent to the Board for their opinion, in the same way that papers are now sent to the various Heads of Departments, and in nine cases out of ten there is no doubt the advice of the Board would be taken.

I cannot see that the Board can require to be placed in a position superior to the Head of a Professional Department. No Head of a Department can do more than advise the Government. An Imperium in imperio is at all times a delicate thing, and I feel sure that the result you wish to attain, as I understand it, could be accomplished by the means I suggest. The appointment of the Board would be gazetted.
