#### [ No. 112.] AUSTRALIA.

SOUTH COAST-LACEPEDE BAY.

(1) FIXED LIGHT AT KINGSTON.

The Government of South Australia has given Notice, that on 15th July, 1889, it is intended to exhibit a light from a lighthouse erected on the extremity of the new iron pile jetty at Kingston (port Caroline), Lacepede bay.—

The light will be a fazed white light of the sixth order, elevated 25 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 9 miles.

The lighthouse will be painted white.

Position approximate, lat. 36° 50′ 15″ S., long. 139° 50′ 55″ E.

#### EAST COAST.

(2) BANK NORTH-WEST OF LOOK-OUT POINT. The following information has been received, relative to the existence of a bank lying about 3 miles north-westward of Look-out point:—

This bank, on which the *Decapolis* grounded, 30th August, 1879, is stated by the Master, Mr. Almond, to be apparently of flat surface composed of clay and sand, with a least depth over it of 2½ fathoms (one cable W.N. W. of the vessel when aground), deepening quickly seaward to 7 and 9 fathoms, and may be an extension of the shoal ground extending from Look-out point.

The following bearings were taken from the ship on the bank, in  $2\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms—tide half flood.

Cape Flattery open a quarter of a point of Look-out point S.E. Remarkable sand patch These bearings place the bank 3 miles distant from Look-out

Position approximate, lat. 14° 47½' S., long. 145° 14' E. (The bearings are Magnetic. Variation 6° Easterly in 1880.)

(1) LA TROBE ISLAND LIGHT—ALTERATION IN COLOUR.

COLOUR.

The Government of Victoria has given Notice, dated 16th April, 1880, that the following alteration has been made in the colour of the light exhibited from near the east point of La Trobe island, approach to port Albert.

The light (fixed and flashing) is now a red light, instead of white as previously.

EAST COAST-POVERTY BAY.

(2) FIXED RED LIGHT AT TURANGA-NUI RIVER ENTRANCE.
