HEREAS by an Ordinance passed in the ninth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Ordinance to make provision for the trial of Criminal "Offences at Albany and other remote Districts "of the Colony of Western Australia," it is provided that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace for the various Districts of this Colony may be holden under and by virtue of the provisions of the said Ordinance, at such times and in such places as the Governor shall, by Proclamation, from time to time appoint; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Ordinance, do hereby appoint Bunbury as a place where, after the month of May next ensuing, such a Court shall be held, subject to the provisions of the said Ordinance, for the trial of Criminal Offences committed within any part of the District known as the Electoral District of Wellington, and described in the Schedule to the "Legislative Council Act Amendment Act, 1873;" and I do further appoint and direct that the said Court shall be held four times in every year, on the first Tuesdays in the months of March, June, September, and December in every year.

Lieut. W. U. Moore, Commanding the Surveying schooner Alacrity, 1880.

[All bearings are Magnetic. Variation 14° Easterly in 1880.]

D'HAUSSEZ GROUP.

Man Rock* (known also as Old Man rock), situated W. 3 N. distant 13 miles from Ohena island (north side of Mercury bay), is about 80 yards in diameter and 200 feet high; it forms a valuable mark for steam coasting vessels navigating between Auckland and the eastern ports of New Zealand.

Sunk Rock.—On which there is a depth of 7 feet, lies 2 cables N.E. by N. from the sunken danger situated E. by S. distant 2 miles from Tepaki point, in the channel between Old Man rock and the mainland.

DIRECTIONS.—Coasting vessels approaching from the westward usually proceed in mid-channel between Channel island and cape Colville, and then keep one mile off shore until eastward of Charles cove.

From thence a course is steered to pass one mile south-west of Great Mercury island, when Ohena island is kept a little eastward of Old Man rock, until the vessel is within a quarter of a mile of that rock.

Pass about half a cable south-west of Old Man rock, and steer S.E. by E. for one mile, until Needle rock bears S.W., when course should be shaped to pass eastward of Castle and Slipper islands.

BAY OF PLENTY.†

Breakers are reported to have been seen westward of Okorapu reef (which is situated 2½ miles westward of Motiti island, north extreme).
