HEREAS by an Ordinance passed in the forty-second year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "The Jury Act, 1871, Amendment Act, 1878," it is provided that whenever the Governor by Proclamation should appoint a Court of General Sessions to be holden in any district, it should be lawful for the Governor by the same or another Proclamation to fix some day other than the Tuesday of the third week in the month of January as the day for first holding the Special Session for the revision of the Jury List; Now therefore I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Ordinance, do hereby fix the seventeenth day of February as the day for first holding the Special Session for the purpose aforesaid.

HEREAS by an Ordinance passed in the ninth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Ordinance to make "provision for the trial of Criminal Offences at "Albany and other remote Districts of the "Colony of Western Australia," it is provided that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace, for the various Districts of this Colony, may be holden under and by virtue of the provisions of the said Ordinance, at such times, and in such places, as the Governor shall by Proclamation from time to time appoint; and whereas I, the said Governor, did by Proclamation dated the twenty-fourth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, appoint Bunbury as a place where such a Court should be held for the District known as the Electoral District of Wellington: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Ordinance, do hereby appoint Bunbury aforesaid as a place where, after the month of May next ensuing, such a Court shall be held, subject to the provisions of the said Ordinance, for the trial of Criminal Offences committed within any part of the District known as the Electoral District of Vasse, as well as of the District of Wellington

aforesaid, which District of Vasse is described in Schedule A of the 33rd Victoria, No. 13; and I do further appoint and direct that the said Court shall be held four times in every year, on the first Tuesdays in the months of March, June, September, and December in every year.
