THE following Regulations prescribed by the Government Resident at Roebourne, for the keeping, dispensing, and selling of Poisons, in the Towns of Roebourne and Cossack, and the North District, are published for general information.

The Poison Sale Act, 1879.

43 Victoria, No. 14.

REGULATIONS as to keeping, dispensing, and selling of Poisons, in the Towns of Roebourne and Cossack, and the North District.

Whereas "The Poison Sale Act, 1879," enacts that the undermentioned articles, viz. :—

- Arsenic and its preparations,
- Prussic Acid,
- Cyanides of Potassium and all Metallic Cyanides,
- Strychnine and all poisonous vegetable alkaloids and their salts,
- Aconite and its preparations,
- Emetic Tartar,
- Corrosive Sublimate,
- Cantharides,
- Savin and its Oil,
- Ergot of Rye and its preparations,

shall be deemed Poisons within the meaning of the said Act;

That a person selling such Poison shall be licensed by the Resident Magistrate of his District;

That he shall observe all the Regulations respecting the sale of Poison, as specified in section 3; and that he shall conform to such further Regulations as to keeping, dispensing, and selling of such Poison as may from time to time be prescribed by the Resident Magistrate of his District:

Notice is hereby given that the following Regulations will be enforced in the Towns of Roebourne and Cossack, and the North District.

1. The book required by section 3 to be kept for the purpose of making entries therein of the sale of Poison shall at all times be available for inspection by any Justice of the Peace, Police Constable, or other Peace Officer.
2. None of such Poisons shall be sold, or disposed of, or be given at any time to any person under the apparent age of twenty-one years, or in a state of intoxication, nor to any aboriginal native, or half-caste native.
3. No person shall keep any of such Poisons for sale, by retail, in any shop, house of business, or other place, without labelling each box, vessel, wrapper, or cover which may contain such Poisons with the word "Poison."

AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST.

GREAT SANDY STRAIT.

(1) DIRECTIONS FOR WIDE BAY BAR.

The Government of Queensland has published the following directions for Wide bay bar, southern entrance of Great Sandy strait.

Crossing the bar at night, Hook point leading lights must be kept in line bearing W. by S., until Inskip point leading lights come in line, which should then be steered for, until a red light on Inskip point opens out. A vessel will then be clear of the spit extending south-eastward from Great Sandy island, and a mid-channel course should be steered until the lights on the west part of Inskip point are brought in line bearing S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., which lead to the Fairway buoy off Snout point, when, if dark, anchor till daylight.

(2) FLAT-TOP ISLAND—DIRECTIONS FOR INNER ANCHORAGE.

Also, the following directions for the Inner anchorage, Flat-top island, approach to Pioneer river:—

Two beacons (white) have been placed on East point, which, kept in line lead clear of the reef extending northward of Flat-top island. Two similar beacons have also been placed on the south-west part of Flat-top island, which, kept in line lead westward of the reef off Flat-top island. Lights will be exhibited from these beacons, when necessary.

DIRECTIONS BY DAY.—Intending to anchor westward of Flat-top island, bring the beacons on East point in line bearing W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., and steer towards them until the beacons on Flat-top island come in line bearing S. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.; then alter course to S. by W. until Flat-top island lighthouse bears S.E.; a vessel can then anchor in not less than 18 feet at low water spring tides.

Vessels of light draught may anchor closer in, where better shelter is afforded during south-easterly gales.

By NIGHT.—Steer in with the two lights on East point in line, until a light on the south-west part of Flat-top island opens out—then proceed as above directed.
