AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST.

NEWCASTLE HARBOR—RED LIGHT ON BREAKWATER.

Information has been received, that the breakwater on the south side of Newcastle harbour entrance now extends about 430 yards in a north-easterly direction from Nobby head—and that on 2nd August, 1880, a light was exhibited about 70 yards from its extremity:—

The light is a fixed red light, elevated 30 feet above high water, visible seaward between the bearings of N.W. by W. and E. by N.

NOTE.—The light on a N.W. by W. bearing leads clear of Big Ben rock; and bearing E. by N. clears the shoal ground extending off Nobby head north-westward of the breakwater.

FOG BELL.

Also, that during thick and foggy weather, a powerful bell will be sounded from the breakwater.

(The bearings are Magnetic. Variation 10½° Easterly in 1880.)

AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST.

PORT PHILLIP ENTRANCE.

(1) POINT LONSDALE AND SWAN SPIT RED LIGHTS DEEPEENED IN COLOUR.

The Government of Victoria has given Notice, that on 1st September 1880, the colour of the red light at point Lonsdale would be deepened to a darker red than previously shown, between the bearings of W. by N. and W. by S. Also, that the colour of Swan spit red light would be deepened between the bearings of N.W. and S.W. by W.

This deepening of colour is made to prevent the possibility of mistaking these lights for the Pile light in the South Channel, when navigating the Eastern entrance of the South channel.

NEW ZEALAND.

NORTH ISLAND—WEST COAST.

(2) MANUKAU HARBOUR—BEACONS ON SOUTH HEAD NOT AVAILABLE AS LEADING MARK.

The Government of New Zealand has given Notice, dated 22nd June, 1880, that the beacons on South head, Manukau harbour, no longer serve as a leading mark for the deepest water in the South channel—Vessels must therefore pay attention to the Semaphore alone.

[The bearings are Magnetic. Variation 8½° Easterly in 1880.]
