SIR,—I have the honor to report having, on the 10th inst., visited and inspected the Swan Protestant Orphanage for boys. No. of Government inmates, 37. The Manager the Venerable the Archdeacon Brown was present. He informed me the health of the children, during the past quarter, had been good, and their conduct satisfactory. The children appeared well fed, and were healthy looking, and neatly clothed. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated.

March 17th.—Visited and inspected the Perth Protestant Orphanage for girls. No. of Government inmates, 24; maintained by private funds, 2; total number 26. They were clean, healthy looking, and neatly clothed. There has been no sickness amongst the children during the past quarter, and their conduct continues good. The food supplied is good in quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated. All the children attend school, which is conducted on the premises under the superintendence of the Matron, Miss Duffield.

The same day I visited and inspected the Native and Half-caste Mission, Perth. No. of boys, 4; do. girls, 13; total number, 17. There has been no sickness amongst them during the past quarter, and their conduct continues good. They were clean, healthy looking, and neatly clothed. The food supplied them is good in quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants. The children attend school which is conducted on the premises under the superintendence of the Matron, Mrs. Ford. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated.

The same day I visited and inspected the Roman Catholic Orphanage for girls. No. of Government inmates, 55; private, 17; total number, 72. They were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking. There has been no sickness amongst them during the past quarter, and their conduct continues good. The food supplied them is good in quality, and they

are allowed sufficient for their wants. The children are educated in the schools attached to the Convent, under the supervision of the Sisters of Mercy. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated.

March 23rd.—Visited and inspected the Roman Catholic Orphanage for boys, at Subiaco. No. of Government inmates, 44; private, 14; total number, 58. They were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking. There has been no sickness amongst them during the past quarter, and their conduct continues good. The food supplied them is good in quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants. The children attend school which is conducted on the premises under the superintendence of the Sisters of Mercy. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated.

The water supply at each Institution is good.
