Sta,—I have the honor to report having, on the 10th inst., visited and inspected the Swan Protestant Orphanage for boys. No. of Government inmates, 37. The Manager the Venerable the Archdeacon Brown was present. He informed me the health of the children, during the past quarter, had been good, and their conduct satisfactory. The children appeared well fed, and were healthy looking, and neatly clothed. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated ventilated.

March 17th.—Visited and inspected the Perth Protestant Orphanage for girls. No. of Government inmates, 24; maintained by private funds, 2; total number 26. They were clean, healthy looking, and neatly clothed. They were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking. There has been no sickness amongst them during the past quarter, and their conduct continues good. The food supplied them is good in quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants. The children are educated in the schools attached to the Convent, under the supervision of the Sisters of Mercy.
