HEREAS it is enacted by the second section of "The Small Debts Ordinance, 1863," that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, and at any time, by Proclamation published in the Western Australian Government Gazette to constitute Local Courts for the recovery of Small Debts and Demands, to be holden at such times and places, and within such Districts throughout the said Colony as may be most fit and convenient, and as may be specified in such Proclamation; and likewise by Proclamation to alter the time, or place, or manner of holding any such Courts; and whereas it has been deemed expedient to alter, as hereinafter specified, the time for holding the Local Court at Dongarra; Now THERE-FORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of such power, do hereby notify and proclaim, that the day for holding a Local Court for the recovery of Small Debts and Demands shall, after the 28th day of April instant, and thenceforth, be the fourth Thursday in each month.

Central Board of Education, Perth, 29th April, 1881.

NHE following two By-Laws adopted by the Perth District Board and approved by the Central Board of Education on the 9th March, 1881, are hereby published for general information.

New By-Laws adopted by the Perth District Board and approved by the Central Board March 9th, 1881.

Requiring Children to be examined half-yearly by Inspector of Schools, if the efficiency of the home instruction appears doubtful.

* No. 6.—That when the District Board have reason to doubt the efficiency of the instruction alleged to be given to any child at *home* or other-wise, the District Board may require such child, on notice in writing being given to the parent, to be examined half-yearly at the nearest Government or Assisted School, at the option of the District Board, by the Inspector of Schools, who shall report upon the child's progress according to the standard of proficiency required of Elementary Schools. Refusal to comply with such notice of the District Board shall be taken as *prima facie* evidence as a breach of the By-Law. the By-Law.

Children suffering from contaminating disorders not admitted.

* No. 7.—Any child suffering from a contam-inating disorder shall be denied admittance to any Government or Assisted School. The parents shall be liable for all school fees payable during the period of non-attendance; also for the penalty recoverable under By-Law No. 12, unless a Medical Certificate be presented stating that the child is under treat-ment; and re-admission to the school shall not be given until a complete cure has been effected.

THE following general By-Laws, compiled and passed by the Geraldton Municipal Council, have been confirmed by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

General By-Laws of the Geraldton Municipality.

AT a Meeting of the Geraldton Municipal Council held this 7th day of June, 1880, it was resolved that in accordance with the 49th sec. of "The Municipal Institutions Act of 1876," the following By-Laws be now adopted by this Council, for the regulation, management, and control of the several matters and things therein set forth, viz.:--

1. The Council shall meet for the transaction of business in the Town Hall, at Geraldton, or such other place or places as the Council may hereafter fix on the first Monday in every month or oftener if necessary.

2. The Supervisor for the time being, duly appointed by the Council, shall have the immediate custody, care, management, and direction of all buildings, lands, streets, paths, jetties, wharfs, trees, posts, fences, works, drains, culverts, and other property belonging to, in charge of, or under the protection, control, or power of the Council.

3. The Collector for the time being, duly appointed by the Council, shall have power to demand and collect all rates, assessments, license fees, fines, forfeitures, rents, tolls, and other sums due to the Council, and his receipt shall be a full and sufficient discharge for the same, and all sums so collected shall be by him paid to the Treasurer at least once a week.

4. The Treasurer shall pay all sums of money received by him from the Collector, or from any other person on account of the Municipality, into the credit of the Council's General Account at the Western Australian Bank in Geraldton, at least once in each month.

5. Any person who shall keep for seven days within the boundaries of the Geraldton Municipality and depasture thereon any cattle, horses, or sheep, without having first obtained a license signed by the Chairman, shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding One pound.

Schedule of License Fees.

For each head of Cattle above 12 months 5 0 Do. above 3 months and under 12 months ... 2 6

Any number of sheep or lambs, amounting to 20 or upwards 5 0

6. All licenses issued by the Chairman of the Council shall continue in force until the 31st of December in each year, and no license shall be issued for a less period than six months.

7. Upon application from any person desirous of transferring his or her license to any other person, it shall be competent for the Collector to transfer the same, by endorsement on the back thereof of the name and residence of the new owner, upon payment of a fee of One shilling for carts and carriages, and Two and Sixpence for every cow so transferred.

8. Any person who shall commit any of the following offences shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding £10.

- Any person who shall, without the consent of the Chairman in writing, cut down, damage, or destroy, or injure any tree, plant, post, fence, gate, drain, watercourse, culvert, jetty, wharf, building, or other property belonging to or in charge of the Council within the boundaries of this Municipality, or who shall light any unguarded fire, or set fire to any straw, wood, or rubbish, or make any bonfire in proximity to any house, building, hay-stack or wood-stack, or other property, without first obtaining permission from the Chairman so to do.
- Or who shall wantonly, or without lawful excuse, discharge any fire-arm, or let off

fireworks, in, near to, or across any public thoroughfare or other open public place in the townsite, £2. Or who shall stack any hay, straw, or other inflammable material within 12 feet of any house or other building and who shall not remove the same within forty-eight hours after due notice by the Chairman.

9. No person shall be allowed to stack more than twenty cords of firewood in one open or uncovered spot within the Municipality without the consent of the Chairman, such stack to be at least twenty yards from any building, under a penalty of $\pounds 5$.

10. Any person who shall within the limits of the Municipality take away or remove from the sea-beach any sand or seaweed, or shall make any pit in the sand, or shall put or place or cause to be put or placed any timber or other goods, chattels, or materials on the beach, and keep the same on the beach for a longer period than seven days, without having first obtained the written permission of the Chairman of the Council, and who shall not remove the same on request by some person on the part of the Council, shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

11. Any person who shall allow his or her chimney to become foul and catch fire from the deposit of soot shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

12. Any owner or occupier of any house, shop, store, or other building within the boundaries of the Municipality, whose roof shall overhang or project over any thoroughfare or footway without having a proper gutter and pipe to carry off the rain, or who shall have any cornice, crane, or hoists, or any other fixtures or projection over-hanging any footway or thoroughfare, without the sanction of the Council, and who shall neglect or refuse to remove or abate such nuisance within 14 days after being required in writing by the Chairman so to do, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

13. Any person allowing stock of any description to stray on the sand hills, or who shall remove therefrom any bush or growth whatever within the townsite, without the consent of the Chairman in writing, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £1 or more than £10 for every such offence. The informer . to receive half the fine.

14. Any person quarrying stone on the Crown Lands in the Municipality, without having first obtained a License from the Chairman for the same, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £1.

LICENSE FEES FOR QUARRYING.

For one square chain 2s. 6d. per man per month.

By-Laws of the Geraldton Municipality concerning the keeping of Goats.

44th Victoria, No. 11.

1. Every person within the Municipality of Geraldton shall be allowed to keep one or more goats, not exceeding four, for milking purposes, upon taking out a license for the same. The license fee for every goat above the age of six months shall be 2s. 6d. per head per annum, in addition to which a fee of one shilling per

head shall be paid to the Collector on the first day of every month, to provide a fund for the payment to a herdsman of a fixed salary; the first payment to be made on the first of day July, 1881.

2. The herd in the daytime shall be in charge of a goatherd who shall be appointed by the Council, at such salary as the said Council shall deem fit; and it shall be the duty of such goatherd to attend at certain places in the town, set apart by the Council for the yarding of goats, and to receive, drive out of town, and return all goats within the hours specified in sec. 5.

3. The person appointed by the Council as goatherd shall deliver to the Collector on the first day of June and January in every year a list showing the number of goats in his charge on those days.

4. Every person the owner of a goat or goats is hereby required to drive or cause to be driven any goat or goats owned by him or her to any place in the townsite which shall be set apart by the Council for the purpose of yarding goats which shall depasture on the lands of the Municipality.

5. Any person who shall knowingly or carelessly suffer any goat or goats (whether attended by a keeper or not) belonging to him or her, or in his or her apparent ownership or charge, to be tethered, or to depasture, feed, or roam about in or upon any street or public thoroughfare, after the hours of eight o'clock in the morning or before seven o'clock in the evening from the first day of October to the first day of April, and after nine o'clock in the morning or before six o'clock in the evening from the first day of April to the thirtieth day of September, shall forfeit and pay for every such goat a sum not exceeding Five shillings; and any person finding any goat or goats straying or trespassing within the hours named shall have power to enclose the said goat or goats in any place by any means most convenient; provided, also, that the person so pounding shall forthwith give notice of his having done so to the Collector, who shall within twelve hours from receipt of such notice cause notices to be posted in some conspicuous place in the town, stating the number and place of confinement of such goats; and if within the space of forty-eight hours after the posting of such notice, the goat or goats so enclosed shall not be claimed by any person, the Collector shall have power to sell such goat or goats by auction or private contract.
