### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Ordinance passed in the 21st year of the Reign of Her present Majesty No. 12, it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony, by Proclamation under his hand, and published in the *Government Gazette*, to notify, declare, and direct that any houses, buildings, erections, enclosures, and other premises used and maintained by the Imperial or Colonial Government shall be and that thereupon the same shall become legal Public Gaols or Prisons of and belonging to the said Colony, for the purposes of receiving, confining, and enforcing the Judicial or Magisterial Sentences, Judgments, and Orders that had been or might be passed upon, awarded to, or made in respect of any prisoner or prisoners within the Colony or its Dependencies by any Civil or Criminal Court of Justice, Judge, or Magistrate thereof; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor; by virtue of the said recited Ordinance, and the Ordinance 12th of Victoria, No. 7, of 1849, do hereby notify and proclaim that the houses, buildings, erections, enclosures, and premises on Rottnest Island, and known as "The Reformatory," shall be legal Public Gaols and Prisons of and belonging to the said Colony, for all the purposes

of the said recited Ordinance, and subject to the provisions of the said Ordinance 12th Victoria, No. 7, of 1849.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the said Colony, this sixteenth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

**T**HE following boundaries defining the Blackwood Magisterial District are published for general information, viz. :—

BLACKWOOD MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the *Northward* by lines extending Eastward from the South-west corner of Wellington Location 171 to a point due South from the South-east corner of Wellington Location 40; thence North passing along the Eastern boundary of said Location 40 to "Gregory's marked line" of road from Bunbury to Kojonup, and thence by the Kojonup or Old Post Road to the junction of the Balgarrup and Blackwood Rivers. On the *Westward* by a South-easterly line from the South-west corner of Wellington Location 171 to the junction of Padbury's Brook with the Blackwood River, and from thence to the S.W. corner of Nelson Location 31 at Majinnup, thence in a S.S. Easterly direction to the S.W. corner of Nelson Location 141. On the *Southward* by an Easterly line passing along the South boundary of Nelson Location 6 at Topanup, to its intersection with the Eastern boundary; and on the *Eastward* by a South-easterly line from the junction of the Balgarrup and Blackwood Rivers in the direction of the North shore of Lake Matilda until it intersects the South boundary.

The boundaries of the Wellington, Sussex, Williams, and Plantagenet Residencies will henceforth be subject to the boundaries of the Blackwood Magisterial District so far as they are affected by them.
