SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of a letter from the Foreign Office enclosing an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the 2nd of March, for giving effect to the Treaty between this Country and Luxemburg, signed on the 24th of November last, for the mutual surrender of Foreign Criminals.

SIR,—I am directed by the Earl of Granville to acquaint you, for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that an Order in Council was passed on the 2nd instant, for carrying into effect the Treaty for the mutual surrender of Fugitive Criminals, signed between Great Britain and Luxemburg, on the 24th November last.

The Order in Council was published in the *Government Gazette* of the 4th inst., of which I am to enclose copies; and I am to add that the Treaty will come into operation in this Country on the 15th inst., in conformity with the stipulation contained in Article XV.

AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST.

MORETON BAY—BRISBANE RIVER
ENTRANCE.

(1) ADDITIONAL LIGHTS IN FRANCIS CHANNEL.

The Queensland Government has given Notice, that on 16th November, 1880, three *white* lights would be exhibited in Francis or West Channel, Brisbane river entrance, from the following positions, viz. :—

1. From the corner beacon at the south-east end of the outer cutting.
2. From the double beacon in the bend.
3. From the corner beacon seaward of the light-vessel.

SOUTH-WEST PACIFIC—FIJI ISLANDS.

VITI LEVU.

(2) LEADING LIGHTS AT SUVA HARBOR.

Information has been received from Lieutenant Moore, commanding H.M. Surveying vessel *Alacrity*, dated 6th December, 1880, that two leading lights are now exhibited on the northern shore of Suva (Tomba-ko-suva) harbor, south-east coast of Viti Levu :—

The low light is a fixed *red* light, visible in clear weather from a distance of 5 miles; it is situated on the beach about $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables eastward of the east end of Nukumaroreko islet.

Position, lat. $18^{\circ} 0' 50''$ S., long. $178^{\circ} 24' 4''$ E.
The light is a fixed *white* light, elevated 320 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of from 8 to 12 miles, it bears from the low light North, distant 1,800 yards.
These lights in line bearing North lead through the channel into Suva harbor.

KANDAVU ISLAND.

(3) N'GALOA HARBOR—LEADING LIGHTS DISCONTINUED,
BEACONS REMOVED.

Also, that the leading lights for the Main channel into N'galoa harbor, Kandavu island, have been discontinued; and the beacons from which they were shown have been removed.

[The bearings are Magnetic. Variation $9\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ Easterly in 1881.]

AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST.

(1) SPENCER GULF—PROPOSED LIGHT ON CORNY POINT.

The Government of South Australia has given Notice, that on or about 10th January 1882, it is proposed to exhibit a light from a lighthouse to be erected on Corny point, east side of Spencer gulf :—

The light will be a fixed *white* light of the third order.
Position approximate, lat. $34^{\circ} 54' 0''$ S., long. $137^{\circ} 0' 30''$ E.
Further information concerning this light will be published in due course.

(2) CAPE NORTHUMBERLAND LIGHT—INTENDED ALTERATION IN CHARACTER.

Also, that on or about 1st April 1882, it is intended to make the following alteration in the character of the light exhibited on cape Northumberland :—

The light will be altered from alternate flashes of red, white, and green, to a *revolving* light of the first order, showing a *bright flash every minute*.

The lighthouse and keeper's dwellings will be moved a short distance eastward of the present position.

Further particulars concerning this light will be given as early as possible.

NEW ZEALAND.

MIDDLE ISLAND—EAST COAST.

(3) TIMARU—RED LIGHTS ON BREAKWATER.

The Government of New Zealand has given Notice, that on 1st January 1881, two lights would be exhibited from the extremity of the breakwater at Timaru :—

The lights are *red* lights, placed 10 feet apart, elevated 18 feet above high water, and should be visible seaward in clear weather from a distance of about 4 miles.

SOUTH-WEST PACIFIC—FIJI ISLANDS.

VITI LEVU—SUVA HARBOR.

(1) PARTICULARS OF LEADING LIGHTS.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 33 (2), of 7th March 1881, on the exhibition of two leading lights on the northern shore of Suva (Tomba-ko-suva) harbor, south-east coast of Viti Levu :—
The following further particulars have been received from Captain Maclear, H.M. Surveying vessel *Alert* :—

The low light is elevated 30 feet above high water.
The high light is not visible eastward of the bearing N.W.
The lighthouses, square in shape and constructed of wood, are painted white, and serve well as day marks.

(6) FIXED GREEN LIGHT AT NA MBUKALOU.

Also, that a light is now exhibited at Na Mbukalou, east side of Suva harbor, to lead clear of the northern extreme of the eastern entrance reef :—

The light is a fixed *green* light; it is not visible southward of the bearing E. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.
Entering the harbor, the light should be steered for immediately it is seen.

(The bearings are Magnetic. Variation $9\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ Easterly in 1881).

NEW ZEALAND PILOT.

NOTICE No. 8.

The following information, relating to portions of the coast of New Zealand, has been principally derived from Notices issued by the New Zealand Government, 1880.

[All Bearings are Magnetic. Variation in 1881.]

Port Nicholson, $15\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ Easterly. Awarua or Bluff harbour, 17° Easterly.

NORTH ISLAND—EAST COAST.

AUCKLAND HARBOR, *a b*—Buoys.—The following buoys have been laid down in Auckland harbour :—
An iron buoy, painted red, in $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms water, at three-quarters of a cable N. 49 deg. E. from the north-east extreme of the Railway pier.
An iron buoy, painted red, in 4 fathoms, at three-quarters of a cable N. 42 deg. W. from the north-west extreme of the Railway pier.

There is a depth of from $3\frac{1}{2}$ to 4 fathoms water between these buoys.
CAVALLI ISLAND, *c d*—A sunken rock has been reported to lie about one mile E.N.E. from Cavalli island.

BAY OF PLENTY.—Motiti island, *e f*—A shoal forming a narrow ridge, with from 2 to 4 fathoms on it, deepening to 10 fathoms rather suddenly to the southward and eastward, and more gradually to the westward, extends from the south extreme of Motiti island for about a mile in a S.W. by S. direction.

Plate island.—A rocky patch (Tokeroa shoal), about three-quarters of a mile long in a N.E. and S.W. direction by half a mile broad, lies south-westward of Plate island. The least water found on this shoal was 3 fathoms, with the south extreme of Plate island bearing N.E., distant $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

COOK STRAIT.

PORT NICHOLSON.—Lambton harbour, *g h*—On the north-west side of Lambton harbour a railway pier has been constructed, extending in a S.S.E. direction; from the south extreme of this pier the north extreme of the outer part of Queen's wharf bears S. 16 deg. W., distant 1 four-tenths cables.

There is a depth of $4\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms close southward of the pier head.
LIGHT.—From the outer extremity of this pier is exhibited a fixed white light.

Buoys.—The following six iron warping buoys, painted red, have been laid down in Lambton harbour :—

A buoy in 18 feet water at 1 nine-tenths cables S. 60 deg. E. from the observation spot on Pipitea point.
A buoy in 22 feet water at 2 eight-tenths cables S. 25 deg. E. from the observation spot on Pipitea point.

Four buoys lie off Queen's wharf; of these, two are situated on the following bearings and distances from the north extreme of the outer part of that wharf:—N. 45 deg. E. distant 1 six-tenths cables, and N. 66 deg. E. distant 2½ cables. The other two are situated on the following bearings and distances from the south extreme of the outer part of Queen's wharf:—S. 45 deg. E. distant one cable, and S. 41 deg. E. distant 1 six-tenths cables.

APPROACH TO PORT NICHOLSON.—Lyall Bay.—A sunken rock (on which the *Sophia R. Lahr's* struck) is said to lie about 1½ cables E. by S. from the extreme of the reef which extends from the west entrance Point of Lyall bay. This rock has about 17 feet on it at low-water springs.

MIDDLE ISLAND.—EAST COAST.

PORT LYTELTON.—On the south-west side of Little port Cooper the position of the landing place of the submarine telegraph cable is marked by a vertical white mark, which is conspicuous from seaward for a distance of three or four miles.

Buoy.—An iron buoy, painted red, lies in 15 feet water at nearly a cable East of the east extreme of Shag reef.

The rock at the west extreme of Shag reef is about 8 feet high.

MIDDLE ISLAND.—SOUTH COAST.

AWARUA OR BLUFF HARBOUR.—Two dolphins have been placed on the Middle spit, which lies north of the wharf on west side of entrance to Bluff harbour. One is situated on the extreme east end of the spit in 12 feet water, and is surmounted by a cross, painted red and white in horizontal bands. The other is on the middle of the spit, in 4 feet water, and surmounted by a Y-shaped beacon, painted red and white in diagonal bands. These dolphins, when kept in line bearing about N.W. by W. ½ W., lead through the deepest part of the channel, between Te Waewae point and Bunt point, in not less than 24 feet water.

Sandy knoll, lying about 3 cables E.N.E. of Starling point, and over which there was formerly a depth of 2 fathoms, is now reported to have over it a depth of 3½ fathoms.

The knoll situated nearly 4 cables S.E. ½ E. of Te Waewae point, and over which there was formerly a depth of 5 fathoms, has shoaled and extended about 1½ cables to the southward; there is only a depth of from 1½ to 2 fathoms over it. A equivoval black and white buoy has been placed on the north-west extreme of this shoal, and a red buoy on its south-east extremity; both of these buoys are in 3 fathoms water. When entering by the west channel these buoys must be left on the starboard hand, and when entering by the north channel on the port hand.
