Section 30.
"That every person who shall offend against this "Ordinance by refusing or neglecting to give any "notice or information required by any of the fore"soing sections, or by knowingly registering any " bith or death contrary to the provisions of any of "the said sections, shall, for every such offence, "forfeit a sum not less than Two pounds nor ex"ceeding Twenty pounds."
