WHEREAS by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature, it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia, for the time being, to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; Now THEREFORE I, Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, K.C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA shall commence and be holden for the despatch of business on MONDAY, THE TWENTY-FIFTH DAY OF JULY, 1881, at two P.M., in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, within the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

NORTHERN AND EASTERN RAILWAYS.

THE Commissioner of Railways hereby gives notice, for general information, that from and after the 5th July, next ensuing, the Government will not be responsible for the safe delivery of Goods beyond the limits of the above lines respectively, nor for any damage or loss sustained by perishable Goods by reason of such Goods being allowed by the Consignees to remain at any Station along the said Lines.
