IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct the publication of the following Minute with reference to the Luncheon Recess allowed to Public Officers.

By His Excellency's Command, GIFFORD, Colonial Secretary.

Governor to Colonial Secretary:

With reference to the recent orders about office hours, it has been represented to me by many Heads of Departments, yourself included, that reducing the mid-day recess to an hour operates hardly on those officers who happen to live at any distance from the offices. I confess that, for my own part, I have always disapproved of officers going home in the middle of the day, but as it appears to be considered almost a necessity here that they should do so, I think almost a necessity here that they should do so, I think that  $\frac{1}{2}$  an hour is not enough in many cases to allow them to take the mid-day meal with their families, and that, if recess be allowed at all, it is better to make it a sufficiently long one to be of real advantage to the officers. I am therefore willing to revert to a one hour recess, to be taken at such time about midday as the Heads of Departments may find most convenient. I rely on Heads of Departments and on all officers concerned to see that this concession is not abused. The Attendance Books recommended by the Commission are to remain in use.

Please circulate this Minute for the information of Heads of Departments, and publish in Government Gazette.

# Notice to the Public.

Postage Stamps for deposit in Post Office Savings Banks by School Children.

T is hereby notified, for general information, that in order to encourage thrift among School Children, it has been decided by His Excellency the Governor that from and after the 1st of August next postage stamps of the value of one shilling, when affixed to the cards provided by the Department for this purpose, be received as deposits in any Post Öffice Savings Bank. Every pupil attending any school, who may wish to save one shilling by penny contributions for ultimate deposit in the Post Office Savings Bank, may do so by purchasing with every penny so saved a penny postage stamp and affixing it to the card. When the squares are filled, the card may be taken to any Post Office Savings Bank, where it will be received by the Postmaster, who will accept it either as the first deposit in a new account then to be opened, or as a subsequent deposit, if the depositor has already opened an account.

If any stamps affixed to the cards are defaced or otherwise damaged, it will result in the rejection of the entire number.

The cards for the collection of postage stamps, and intended for distribution either to schools or to the children attending schools, may be obtained at every Post Office Savings Bank, where further information will be afforded.
