SIR,—I have the honor to report having, on the 15th June, visited and inspected the Roman Catholic Orphanage for girls. No. of Government inmates, 53; maintained by private funds, 18; total number, 71. They were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking. Their health during the past quarter has been good, and their conduct satisfactory. The food supplied is good in quality, and they are not stinted. The children attend school, which is conducted on the premises under the supervision of the Sisters of Mercy. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated.

The same day I visited and inspected the Native and Half-caste Mission, Perth. No. of boys, 4; girls, 13; total number, 17. They were clean, healthy looking, and neatly clothed. There has been no sickness amongst them during the past quarter, and their conduct has been good. The food supplied is good in quality, and they are not stinted. The children attend school, which is conducted on the premises under the superintendence of the Matron, Mrs. Ford. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated.

June 16th.—Visited and inspected the Perth Protestant Orphanage for girls. No. of Government inmates, girls, 29; infant boys, 5; private, 2; total number, 36. They were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking. A few of the children were suffering slightly from whooping cough; with this exception their health has been good. The food supplied is good, and they are not stinted. The children attend school, which is conducted on the premises under the superintendence of the Matron, Miss Duffield. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated.

June 17th.—Visited and inspected the Swan Protestant Orphanage for boys. No. of Government inmates, 33; private, 5; total number, 38. The Manager, the Venerable Archdeacon Brown, was present. He informed me the health of the children during the quarter had been good. The children were clean, neatly clothed, and appeared well fed and healthy looking. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated.

June 22nd.—Visited and inspected the Roman Catholic Orphanage for boys at Subiaco. No. of Government inmates, 45; maintained by private funds, 10; total number, 55. They were clean, neatly clothed, and appeared well fed and healthy locking. Their health during the past quarter has been good, and their conduct satisfactory. The food supplied to them is good in quality, and they are not stinted. The children attend school, which is conducted on the premises under the supervision of the Sisters of Mercy. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated.

The water supply at each Institution is good.

Notice to the Public.

Postage Stamps for deposit in Post Office Savings Banks by School Children.

This hereby notified, for general information, that in order to encourage thrift among School Children, it has been decided by His Excellency the Governor that from and after the 1st of August next postage stamps of the value of one shilling, when affixed to the cards provided by the Department for this purpose, be received as deposits in any Post Office Savings Bank. Every pupil attending any school, who may wish to save one shilling by penny contributions for ultimate deposit in the Post Office Savings Bank, may do so by purchasing with every penny so saved a penny postage stamp and affixing it to the card. When the squares are filled, the card may be taken to any Post Office Savings Bank, where it will be received by the Postmaster, who will accept it either as the first deposit in a new account then to be opened, or as a subsequent deposit, if the depositor has already opened an account.

If any stamps affixed to the cards are defaced or otherwise damaged, it will result in the rejection of the entire number.

The cards for the collection of postage stamps, and intended for distribution either to schools or to the children attending schools, may be obtained at every Post Office Savings Bank, where further information will be afforded.
