IN accordance with the recommendation contained in the Report of the Pearl Shell Fisheries Commission, dated 29th July, 1880, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve of the Pearl Shell Banks in Sharks Bay, lying between Cape Heirisson and Cape Levillain to the westward, being closed for a period of 5 years from this date.

Amended Regulations made by the Governor, in Executive Council, under "The Pearl Shell Fishery Regulation Act, 1875." 39 Vic., No. 13.

Whereas the Governor, in Executive Council, did make and publish, under the second section of the Act 39th Vict., No. 13, Regulations with regard to the mode in which, the times at which, and the circumstances under which, diving for Pearl Shells shall or shall not be carried on; and with regard to the persons whom it shall be unlawful to employ therein; and also with regard to the accommodation to be afforded in the ships to be employed in connection therewith, and the provisioning of the same, and the

number of persons to be carried in the same; which Regulations were published in the Government Gazette of December 8th, 1880, and which Regulations the Governor, in Executive Council, has power by the said Act, from time to time to alter, vary, or repeal; And whereas it is expedient that the said Regulations should, in certain particulars, be altered, varied, and repealed:

I, Sir William Cleaver Francis Robinson, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, do by these Amended Regulations, made in pursuance of the said Act, by and with the consent and advice of the Executive Council of the said Colony, direct and declare as follows, that is to say:—

- 1. The expression "Principal Regulations," wherever occurring herein, shall be taken to mean the aforesaid Regulations published in the Government Gazette of December 8th, 1880.
- 2. At the close of the Fishing Season in each year, in every case when the Resident Magistrate or Inspector of Pearl Shell Fisheries shall be satisfied that an Aboriginal Native is desirous of entering of his own free will and accord, during the period of the ensuing close season, into the domestic service of the master in whose employ he may have worked during the preceding Fishing Season, and that such native is also desirous of reengaging himself with the same master for the period of the next ensuing Fishing Season, it shall be lawful for the said Resident Magistrate or Inspector to grant a permission in writing to the master or employer of such Aboriginal Native in the form attached hereto; and it shall thereupon be lawful for such master (notwithstanding anything contained in the Principal Regulations) to engage such native or natives, whose names or marks or numbers shall appear in such permission, to remain in his domestic service during the ensuing close season, and to work as pearl fishers during the succeeding Fishing Season. Such permission

shall be valid for the space of one year only from the date of its issue, but the same may be renewable by the Resident Magistrate from year to year. The permission shall be made and signed in triplicate, one copy shall remain in the office of the Resident Magistrate and one copy shall remain with the said Inspector and the other shall be given to the employer of such

- 3. Notwithstanding anything in the Principal Regulations contained, the season during which it shall be lawful to carry on diving and fishing operations for pearl shells shall be as follows, that is to say:
 - (1.) From Cape Preston, Eastward and Northward, from the 15th September to the 15th of April, inclusive.
 - (2.) From Cape Preston, Westward and Southward, from the 1st of October to the 30th April.

And it shall be lawful for any person to hire Aboriginal Natives for and during the continuation of such seasons. Regulation No. 2, and Sub-clauses 2, 3, and 6 of Regulation No. 1 of the Principal Regulations are amended hereby, and shall be construed together with this Regulation.

- 4. Notwithstanding anything contained in No. 4 of the Principal Regulations it shall be lawful, for the employer or person in charge to permit laborers and divers to dive, without the diving apparatus therein mentioned, in water whose depth shall not exceed seven fathoms.
- 5. It shall not be necessary for the employer or person in charge to see that any laborer or diver is brought on board the ship or boat from which he shall have dived, in accordance with the provisions contained in No. 5 of the Principal Regulations, unless the water in which such laborer or diver shall have dived be exceeding two fathoms in depth.
- 6. The working hours in any day shall not exceed eight; and in no case shall any laborer or diver be employed at work for a longer period than eight hours; and no laborer or diver shall be engaged in actual diving operations for more than four consecutive hours, and every laborer or diver who shall have been so employed in actual diving operations for the space of four hours consecutively shall have one hour's spell or cessation from work. The cessation from work at mid-day, provided for by No. 9 of the Principal Regulations, shall no longer be enforced.

Permission to continue Aboriginal Natives in Service. These are to permit the Aboriginal Natives, whose names, or marks, or numbers are set forth at the foot hereof, to continue in the domestic service of A. B., from the close of the Pearl Fishing Season, 18 , to the commencement of the season, 18 , and to continue in the service of the said A. B. as Pearl Fishers during the continuance of the season

Order made by the Governor in Executive Council under "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880." 44 Vict., No 5

Whereas by Section 2 of the said Act it is stated that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Executive Council to make such orders as he may think ex-Council to make such orders as he may think expedient for preventing the introduction into Western Australia of insects or of matter destructive or prejudicial to vegetation: I, Sir William Cleaver Francis Robinson, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by this Order, made in Executive Council in pursuance of the said Act, do direct and declare that it shall not be lawful for any person to land or introduce into the Colony any Grape Vine or any portion thereof from any of the Australian or any portion thereof from any of the Australian Colonies.

ENDERS (in duplicate endorsed "Tenders for [as the case man had Mail ?") for [as the case may be] Mail,") will be received at this Office, until noon of Monday, the 31st October, 1881, for the conveyance of the undermentioned Mails, for one, two, or three years,

- 1. From Guildford to York, and vice versâ, as at present, in a four-wheeled spring vehicle, twice a week.
- 2. From Guildford to Newcastle, and vice versâ, as at present, in a four-wheeled spring vehicle, twice a week.
- 3. From Perth to Vasse, and vice versû, viû the intermediate places, as at present, in a four-wheeled spring vehicle, twice a week.

Persons tendering will have the option of purchasing the horses and vehicles now employed in the conveyance of the above Mails at a fair valuation, preference being given to such tenders.

Accommodation must be provided in the conveyances for at least six passengers on the Eastern and seven on the Southern Line.

The time of arrival and departure of the Post Office Mails at and from the several Post Offices shall be on such days and at such hours as the Postmaster General shall from time to time appoint.

In the case of any failure on the part of the Contractor in carrying out the terms of his Contract, and observing the time appointed by the Postmaster General, it shall be competent for the Postmaster General to hire the necessary means of conveyance for such Mails, and to deduct from moneys due or accruing to the Contractor the cost of such service.

The Postmaster General shall determine the roads or routes by which such Mails shall be conveyed, and shall have the power to order any deviation that may appear to him desirable; compensation for increased distance,

consequent upon any such deviation, shall be paid to the Contractor, at the Contract rate per mile.

The Contractor shall convey and deliver all Mails which may be intrusted to him under the authority of the Postmaster General or any of the Postmasters, and shall provide secure and watertight lockers for such Mails.

Men, vehicles, horses, and every person or thing employed in the conveyance of such Mails, shall be subject to the approval of the Postmaster General.

The Postmaster General shall be previously informed by the Contractor of the name of every driver or other person entrusted with the custody of such Mails.

In case any servant of the Contractor employed in connection with such Mail Service shall be dismissed for misconduct or neglect, the name of such servant shall be forthwith reported to the Postmaster General, and the servant so dismissed shall not be eligible for re-employment in such service without the sanction of the Postmaster General.

The Contractor shall not assign the benefit of any portion of his contract without the sanction of the Postmaster General.

The Contractor shall be liable for the following penalty, which shall be deducted, on the authority of the Postmaster General, from any amount falling due to him on account of his contract:—For conveyance by his servants or passengers, or other person, of any correspondence or matter liable to postage charge, without the permission or direction of the Postmaster General (unless under instructions as to roadside correspondence and loose bags), any sum not exceeding £3 for such offence.

All journeys which ought to commence on a day previous to the conclusion of the Contract, as well as all other Mail services ensuing on the route, must be accomplished by the Contractor.

The Contractor must understand that no excuse for delay will be entertained unless supported by certificates from persons of known respectability as to the cause of delay, and that it is not attributable to the absence of ample provision for efficiently carrying out the terms of the Contract.

The Mails must be conveyed at the rate of at least seven miles an hour, inclusive of stoppages.

The Contractor is required to convey loose letters given to him by any Postmaster for delivery on the road; and, unless specially exempted, shall, when applied to by any person on the road, receive letters for conveyance to the nearest Post Office.

No tenders will be entertained unless they bear the signatures of the Sureties.

If the Contractor shall fail in the performance of any one or more of the above conditions, the Postmaster General, in his discretion, may require the Sureties to complete, and they shall accordingly complete, the contract at their own expense and risk in all things.

Where Mails are conveyed in wheeled vehicles, the Contractor will be required to provide an Officer of the Post or Telegraph Department with a free passage, if called upon to do so by the Postmaster General.

The Government will reserve to themselves the right to terminate the contract at any time, by giving three months notice.

Two approved Sureties will be required to join the Contractor in a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the duties required to be performed.

The Government do not bind themselves to accept the lowest or any tender.

Special Forms of Tender with conditions attached may be obtained on application to the various Resident Magistrates and Postmasters, and at the General Post Office, Perth; and no tender will be entertained unless rendered on the prescribed form.
