To HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR:

As Umpires at the Sham Fight of the Volunteers on the 8th instant, we have the honor to report, for the information of Your Excellency, that the operations were carried out according to the "General Idea" prescribed: the attack by the Fremantle and Guildford Corps, and the defence by the Metropolitan Corps posted on the Cemetery Hill.

The design of the attack was under cover of a feint to seize the position of an advanced guard of the enemy, and thereby delay his further advance by occupying the strong position grasped by a forced march.

The position taken up by the defending force was well conceived, but scouts should have been sent out when the attack on the left of the position was found to have been only a feint, in order to have ascertained where the direct attack was about to be delivered, as the whole force should then have been concentrated at that point in order to repel it, leaving only a few sentries to watch the side of the camp. The defenders' guns were put out of action from want of ammunition; had this not occurred, it is easy to imagine that the attacking force might have been repelled when they massed their men on the right flank for the final rush. The sally on the part of the commander of the defending force, as counter attack, was very well conceived, but a little late; though, had the guns been in action, it would undoubtedly have borne good results, and the attacking force in all probability would have had to retire for a time, and make a fresh assault; but as it was they undoubtedly penetrated the lines in the right centre. The defending force, constituting as they did an advanced guard, ought, when taking up the position they did—considering the nature of the ground—to have posted their advanced sentries along the drain in front and on the inner border of the clear ground on their right flank.

Working within the lines laid down, the position occupied by the defenders might have been almost impregnable, unless they were opposed to an overwhelming force. With the sentries posted in skirmishing order, having supports at certain intervals to reinforce if necessary, the whole retiring gradually when necessary, the advanced guard would have been able to ascertain easily the point of the real attack in time to mass a sufficient force in opposition.

The officers and men of the defending force should have knelt more than they did, as they were on the sky line, and could be picked off by the force ascending the hill.

The feint by the attacking force on the left of the position was admirably executed, and accomplished its object, though an endeavor was made to push it home, and accordingly met with a severe handling, but the men were drawn off well, and formed afterwards most creditably the support to the main attack.

The real attack was very well planned, the men being well brought up and a most effective fire opened.

Had the defenders' guns been in action, it is difficult to say definitely which force would have won, but, as it was, the attacking force penetrated the position, though we think it is a moot point whether they could have maintained it. On these grounds we are of opinion the fight to the "cease fire" was a drawn battle, with the balance at that moment in favor of the attack.

We desire to express our thorough appreciation of the behaviour of all ranks, and the soldierly spirit that prevailed all, and wish to add a tribute to the subordination and control that existed; and trust that all volunteers will recognise the usefulness of sham fights; and we further hope that ere long their services may be again requisitioned for a battle on a larger scale.

FENDERS (in duplicate endorsed "Tenders for [as the case may be] Mail,") will be received at this Office, until noon of Monday, the 31st October, 1881, for the conveyance of the undermentioned Mails, for one, two, or three years, viz.:--

- 1. From Guildford to York, and vice versâ, as at present, in a four-wheeled spring vehicle, twice a week.
- 2. From Guildford to Newcastle, and vice verså, as at present, in a four-wheeled spring vehicle, twice a week.
- From Perth to Vasse, and vice versů, viů the intermediate places, as at present, in a four-wheeled spring vehicle, twice a week.

Persons tendering will have the option of purchasing the horses and vehicles now employed in the conveyance of the above Mails at a fair valuation, preference being given to such tenders.

Accommodation must be provided in the conveyances for at least six passengers on the Eastern and seven on the Southern Line.

The time of arrival and departure of the Post Office Mails at and from the several Post Offices shall be on such days and at such hours as the Postmaster General shall from time to time appoint.

In the case of any failure on the part of the Contractor in carrying out the terms of his Contract, and observing the time appointed by the Postmaster General, it shall be competent for the Postmaster General to hire the necessary means of conveyance for such Mails, and to deduct from moneys due or accruing to the Contractor the cost of such service.

The Postmaster General shall determine the roads or routes by which such Mails shall be conveyed, and shall have the power to order any deviation that may appear to him desirable; compensation for increased distance, consequent upon any such deviation, shall be paid to the Contractor, at the Contract rate per mile.

The Contractor shall convey and deliver all Mails which may be intrusted to him under the authority of the Postmaster General or any of the Postmasters, and shall provide secure and watertight lockers for such Mails.

Men, vehicles, horses, and every person or thing employed in the conveyance of such Mails, shall be subject to the approval of the Postmaster General.

The Postmaster General shall be previously informed by the Contractor of the name of every driver or other person entrusted with the custody of such Mails.

In case any servant of the Contractor employed in connection with such Mail Service shall be dismissed for misconduct or neglect, the name of such servant shall be forthwith reported to the Postmaster General, and the servant so dismissed shall not be eligible for re-employment in such service without the sanction of the Postmaster General.

The Contractor shall not assign the benefit of any portion of his contract without the sanction of the Postmaster General.

The Contractor shall be liable for the following penalty, which shall be deducted, on the authority of the Postmaster General, from any amount falling due to him on account of his contract:—For conveyance by his servants or passengers, or other person, of any correspondence or matter liable to postage charge, without the permission or direction of the Postmaster General (unless under instructions as to roadside correspondence and loose bags), any sum not exceeding £3 for such offence.

All journeys which ought to commence on a day previous to the conclusion of the Contract, as well as all other Mail services ensuing on the route, must be accomplished by the Contractor.

The Contractor must understand that no excuse for delay will be entertained unless supported by certificates from persons of known respectability as to the cause of delay, and that it is not attributable to the absence of ample provision for efficiently carrying out the terms of the Contract.

The Mails must be conveyed at the rate of at least seven miles an hour, inclusive of stoppages.

The Contractor is required to convey loose letters given to him by any Postmaster for delivery on the road; and, unless specially exempted, shall, when applied to by any person on the road, receive letters for conveyance to the nearest Post Office.

No tenders will be entertained unless they bear the signatures of the Sureties.

If the Contractor shall fail in the performance of any one or more of the above conditions, the Postmaster General, in his discretion, may require the Sureties to complete, and they shall accordingly complete, the contract at their own expense and risk in all things.

Where Mails are conveyed in wheeled vehicles, the Contractor will be required to provide an Officer of the Post or Telegraph Department with a free passage, if called upon to do so by the Postmaster General.

The Government will reserve to themselves the right to terminate the contract at any time, by giving three months notice.

Two approved Sureties will be required to join the Contractor in a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the duties required to be performed.

The Government do not bind themselves to accept the lowest or any tender.
