# PROCLAMATION

THEREAS by the third section of "The Customs Ordinance, 1860," after declaring the limits of certain Ports of the said Colony it is provided amongst other things that it shall be lawful for the Governor to alter or vary the limits and boundaries of any of the said Ports and to establish any new Port or Ports as to him may seem meet by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim all that piece of water being part of the River Swan, and known as Perth Water, bounded on the North-East by Perth Causeway, on the Southward by the left bank of Swan River downwards to Point Belches; on the South-West by a North-Westerly line from Point Belches to the right bank of Swan River, and on the Westward and Northward by the said right bank of River upwards to the North-West end of the Causeway aforesaid, to be a Port of the said Colony.

# WARRANT

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

HEREAS by the Ordinance passed in the 24th year of Her Majesty's reign No. 5, intituled "The Customs Ordinance, 1860," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by his warrant from time to time to appoint the Ports in the said Colony which shall be Warehousing Ports for the purposes of the said Ordinance, and also what sort of goods in addition to wines, spirits, and tobacco may be warehoused without payment of duty upon the first entry thereof: Now know ye that I, Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, by virtue of the power so vested in me, and with the advice of the Executive Council as aforesaid, do hereby appoint the Port of Perth as a Warehousing Port for the purposes of the said Ordinance; and I do further, by virtue of such power, and by and with the advice as aforesaid, declare that in any Queen's Warehouse to be provided in such Port, there may be warehoused in addition to wines, spirits, and tobacco all such general merchandise and other goods as the Chief Collector of Customs may approve of; and I do further appoint that such Port shall be and remain a Warehousing Port for the purposes of the said Ordinance, until such time as this Warrant shall be revoked by me in accordance with the provisions of the said Ordinance.

THE Secretary of State having recently had occasion to direct His Excellency the Governor to call attention to that portion of the Colonial Regulations which requires that communications to the Sccretary of State from gentlemen in the Colonies should be made through the Governor of the Colony in which they may happen to reside, His Excellency deems it advisable that the following extract from the Regulations should be published for general information :-

"217. Persons in a Colony, whether Public "Functionaries or private individuals, who have any "representations of a public or private nature to "make to Government, should address them to the "Governor of the Colony; or, if the Colony be a "dependency of a Governor-in-chief, then to the "Officer in the immediate administration of its Gov-

"218. The duty of the Governor or Administrator of the Colony is to receive and act upon each such representation as public expediency or justice to "the individual may appear to require, with the "assistance in certain cases of his Executive Council; "and if he doubts what steps to take thereupon, or "if public advantage may appear to require it, to "consult or report to the Secretary of State. Every "individual has, however, the right to address the "Secretary of State, if he thinks proper. But in "this case he must transmit such communication, "unsealed, and in triplicate, to the Governor or "Administrator, applying to him to forward it in "due course to the Secretary of State.

"219. Every letter, memorial, or other document "which may be received by the Secretary of State from a Colony, otherwise than through the Gov-"ernor, will, unless a very pressing urgency justifies a departure from the rule, be referred back to the "Governor for his report.

"220. This rule, requiring transmission of corres"pondence with the Secretary of State through the
"Governor, is based on the strongest grounds of
"public convenience, in order that all communi"cations may be duly verified, as well as reported
"on, before they reach the Secretary of State. It
"extends, therefore, to communications relating to
"public affairs as well as the concerns of the writer;
"to those of all Public Functionaries of whatever
"rank, and to those from public bodies." "rank, and to those from public bodies."

#### MARINE BOARD BY-LAW.

THE following by-law, made by the Marine Board of South Australia, and approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council, is published for general information, and will take effect from the 24th day of October, 1881.

#### LIGHT DUES.

At a meeting of the Marine Board of South Australia, held at the Marine Board Offices, Port Adelaide, on Thursday, the 6th day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one—

#### Present:

Captain B. H. Ferguson, S.M., President, Captain J. W. Smith, J.P., John Formby, Esq., S. D. Glyde, Esq., J.P., and Capt. A. McCoy, J.P.,

the following by-law was duly made, pursuant to the powers conferred by the Marine Board Acts of 1860, 1873, and 1879; and the Board directed that such by-law should be substituted for that made on the 7th day of April, 1881, and numbered 11, which is therefore hereby repealed:—

#### No. 11.—LIGHT DUES.

Light dues shall be paid on all vessels (except those exempt under clause 3 herein) according to the undermentioned scale, viz.:—

- From or to any part beyond the limits of the province ... ... 1d. per ton register.
   On ships trading within the province the following coasting light dues shall be paid, viz.:—

On each ship under 30 tons register 0 50 tons register... ... ... ... ... ... 0 15 ter or part tons register... ... ... ... 0 15 ter or part tons register... ... ... 1 5 for a quarder 100 tons register ... ... 1 5 ter in advance. On each ship of 100 tons register or over,  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per ton in, and  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per ton out.

#### Vessels Exempt.

3. Light dues shall not be charged on the following vessels,

Her Majesty's ships of war, troopships, and transports hired by Her Majesty's Government; but this exemption shall not apply to merchant ships freighted wholly or in part by the Government for the voyage to or from Port Adelaide.

Ships of war belonging to Sovereign Powers in alliance with Her Majesty.

Ships belonging to the Royal Yacht Squadron, and yachts or ships used solely for pleasure, and not engaged in trade or the conveyance of passengers for hire.

Ships outfitting to or refitting from whale fisheries.

#### Northern Territory.

4. The Northern Territory, for the purpose of this by-law, is considered to be beyond the limits of the province.

Certificate of Registry to be produced.

5. The masters of all ships for which light dues are charged must, within twenty-four hours after arrival, produce the certificate of registry of the ship at the offices of the Marine Board, or, in the case of vessels on which a quarterly charge is made, at least once in every three months.

#### Clearance of Ships.

6. A receipt for light dues when levied shall be given to every person paying the same; and no officer of Customs, at any port, shall grant a clearance or transire for any such ship unless the receipt for the same is produced to him. The receipt for light dues must be exhibited by the master or person in charge of any ship to any officer of the Marine Board, at such times as may be deemed necessary.

The ordinary ration of Vegetables to consist of 1lb. of Potatoes; but when demanded by the Government, and in season, the following equivalents must be supplied twice a week: Pumpkins, 2lbs.; or Turnips, Carrots, or Cabbage, 1½lb.; or Onions, ¼lb., for every pound of Potatoes.

All supplies must be delivered in good and sound packages; Corn and Flour sacks, and Oil casks, will be returned to the Contractors; other packages will be retained free of charge.

The Contractors will be liable for any expense which may be incurred by the Government in consequence of the non-performance of their contracts.
