HEREAS by "The Stamp Act, 1881," it is enacted that payment of any Stamp Duty required by the said Act to be paid in respect of any instrument shall be made (until the Governor shall by Proclamation to be inserted in the Government Gazette otherwise prescribe) by affixing on the face of the instrument an adhesive stamp or stamps denoting the amount of such duty: Now THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS Robinson, in exercise of the power so in me vested, do hereby prescribe and declare that the Stamp Duty on Bankers' Cheques shall be denoted either by an embossed or impressed stamp or by an adhesive stamp to be affixed on such cheques in the manner required by the said Act.

Scab Act, Amendment Act, 1881, 45 Vict., No. 2.

IS Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct the publication, for general information, of section 6 of "The Scab Act Amendment Act, 1881":-

Sec. 6—"Every owner of Sheep shall, on the "last Saturday in the month of December in "each year, make a return in writing, signed by him, of all sheep kept and depastured by him; "and if such sheep are kept and depastured by "such owner in separate districts, then such "owner shall make separate returns of all sheep "so kept and depastured in such separate dis-tricts, and shall deliver or cause to be de-livered such return or returns, within fourteen "days after the same shall have been made, to "the Resident Magistrate or Magistrates of the "respective districts within which such sheep "are so kept and depastured; and any owner "who shall make default herein shall be guilty "of an offence within the meaning of 'The Scab "Act, 1879.'"
