HEREAS by "The Stamp Act, 1881," it is enacted that payment of any Stamp Duty required by the said Act to be paid in respect of any instrument shall be made (until the Governor shall by Proclamation to be inserted in the Government Gazette otherwise prescribe) by affixing on the face of the instrument an adhesive stamp or stamps denoting the amount of such duty: Now THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, in exercise of the power so in me vested, do hereby prescribe and declare that the Stamp Duty on Bankers' Cheques, or on any order for the payment of money or for the payment of goods or for drafts on demand, shall be denoted either by an embossed or impressed stamp or by an adhesive stamp to be affixed on such cheques in the manner required by the said Act.
