WHEREAS by a Deed Poll of Grant, bearing date the twelfth day of December, 1881, under the hand of the Governor and Public Seal of the Colony, the land described and designated in Grant No. 134 was granted to ALFRED CHARLES SMITH; And whereas by the said Deed Poll power was reserved to the Crown to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said land which it might at any time by the Crown be deemed necessary to resume for making roads, canals, bridges, towing paths, or other works of public utility or convenience, so, nevertheless, that the lands to be resumed should not exceed one-twentieth part in the whole of the land so granted, and that no such resumption should be made of any lands upon which any buildings may have been erected or which may be in use as gardens or otherwise for the more convenient occupation of any such buildings; And whereas the piece or parcel of land hereinafter described is necessary for the purposes of the Second Section of the Eastern Railway of the said Colony: Now Know YE that Her Most Gracious Majesty doth hereby, and by virtue of the said power and authority reserved and contained in the said recited Deed Poll, resume, for the purposes aforesaid, All that portion of Grant No. 754 in the Swan District, marked and numbered on the Plans and in the Books of the Office of the Surveyor General (not exceeding, however, in the whole one-twentieth of the said grant nor

being otherwise improved within the meaning of the said Grant), which portion is delineated and marked off in the Plan of the said Second Section of the Railway, kept and open to inspection in the Office of the Commissioner of Railways, Perth.
