TORRES STRAITS.

MONETA SHOAL AND BANDA ROCK.

The following information respecting the Moneta Shoal and the Banda Rock, has been obtained by Captain Maclear, R.N., of H.M.S. "Alert."

The Moneta Shoal does not exist; the "Moneta" probably struck on the Harrison Shoal, a little further north.

Banda Rock was found to be a small patch lying 6 cables N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. from Booby Island summit, and having 9 feet of water on it at low-water, with 6 fathoms all round.

AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST.

(1) CAPE OTWAY LIGHTHOUSE—RED LIGHT EXHIBITED.

The Government of Victoria has given Notice, that on 18th July 1881, a red danger light was exhibited from cape Otway lighthouse, 48 feet below the revolving light.

The red light is so screened as to be obscured when approaching from seaward, until 4 miles distant, on a N. by W. bearing; and will be visible (in clear weather) to a vessel proceeding on a W. by S. or E. by N. course, until ran out of sight at 8 miles distant.

NOTE.—This red light is exhibited to warn Mariners of approaching danger, and when seen, a vessel should alter course to run it out of sight.—In thick or foggy weather Mariners should not rely on sighting the red light, but should keep a good offing.

PORT PHILLIP ENTRANCE.

(2) DEEP WATER CHANNEL—ALTERATION IN COLOUR OF INNER LEADING BEACON.

Also, with reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 131 (1), of 14th July 1881, on the erection of two leading beacons indicating a deep water channel between the Heads, port Phillip entrance:—

Further Notice has been given, dated 24th June 1881, that the inner beacon in Lonsdale light, is black and white chequered, instead of white as previously.

(3) WEST CHANNEL—PILE LIGHT EXHIBITED, LIGHT-VESSEL WITHDRAWN.

Also, that on 8th August 1881, a light was exhibited from a lighthouse built on piles in 15 feet water, on the north-east side of West sand, West channel, port Phillip entrance:—

The light is a fixed white light, elevated 31 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 11 miles.

NOTE.—Vessels must pass half a cable eastward of this lighthouse.

Also, that on the exhibition of the pile light, West channel light-vessel would, until withdrawn, show a riding light only.

SIR,—I have the honor to report having, on the 5th inst., visited and inspected the Perth Protestant Orphanage for girls. Number of Government inmates, 30; infant boys, 6; maintained by private funds, 1; total number, 37. They were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking. The food supplied to the children is good in quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants. There has been no sickness amongst the children during the past quarter, and their conduct has been good. They attend school, which is conducted on the premises under the superintendence of Miss Duffield; they also assist in the routine work of the Institution, and are carefully trained to habits of industry. The dormitories have lately been painted and renovated, and were clean and well ventilated. The water supply is good.

The same day I visited and inspected the Native and Half-caste Mission. Number of boys, 5; Number of girls, 14; total number, 19. There has been no sickness amongst the children during the past quarter, and their conduct continues good. They were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking. The food supplied to them is good in quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated. The water supply is good.

December 6th.—Visited and inspected the Roman Catholic Orphanage for girls. Number of Government inmates, 51; maintained by private funds, 20; total number, 71. They were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking. Their health during the past quarter has been good, and their conduct satisfactory. The food supplied to the children is good in quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants. The children attend school, which is conducted on the premises under the superintendence of the Sisters of Mercy. They also assist in the routine work of the Institution, and are trained to habits of industry. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated. The water supply is good.

December 7th.—Visited and inspected the Roman Catholic Orphanage at Subiaco. Number of Government inmates, 44; maintained by private funds, 11; total number, 55. They were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking. The food supplied

the children is good in quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants. They attend school, which is conducted on the premises under the supervision of the Sisters of Mercy. They also assist in the routine work of the Institution. The elder boys are taught carpentering and other useful trades. The manufacture of olive oil at the Orphanage promises well; this year, with comparatively rude appliances, nearly 100 gallons of first-class oil have been made by the boys, the produce of trees growing at the Institution. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated. The water supply is good.

December 8th.—Visited and inspected the Protestant Orphanage for boys on the Swan. Number of Government inmates, 27; maintained by private funds, 4; total number, 31. The children were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking. The food supplied them is good in quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated. Owing to the exceptionally dry season the well which supplied the Institution with water has failed, and the water required for the Orphanage has now to be carted for a considerable distance.
