SIR,—I have the honor to state, for Your Excellency's information, that the occasional break down in the Locomotives since the opening of the Eastern Railway has arisen in the first place from defective workmanship in the two Tank Engines, and what is known as Robb's Engine has been laid up in consequence of the immense amount of mileage it had run without an opportunity for its repair.

The more recent cause, however, of these break downs in all three Engines has been from the defective water at Fremantle and Guildford, which has only shown itself in full force during the summer months; but as soon as I ascertained such to be the case, prompt action was taken with a view to its remedy, and no blame therefore can possibly be attributed to the management.

I confess that had I anticipated the amount of Traffic we have had, I should have sent for more Engines, but as soon as I found it was likely to continue, another Locomotive was immediately indented for; but who could have foreseen the great strain on our Rolling Stock occasioned by the Perth International Exhibition? Had I ordered Engines in anticipation of our requirements I should have been charged with gross extravagance, as I have even been for providing what we already possess, and I had therefore in my Estimate for the Second Section of the Line appropriated £7,000 for additional Locomotive power.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners, No. 2 of 1881, masters of vessels and others are hereby informed that, owing to unforeseen circumstances, the light on Corny Point, Spencer Gulf, will not be exhibited until the 1st March, 1882.

The light, a fixed white one of the third order, in lat. 34° 54' S., and long, 137° 1' E., (approximately) having the focal plane 98 feet above ordinary sea level, will be visible from a vessel's deck, in clear weather, at a distance of fourteen (14) miles, and illuminate an arc of the sea horizon of 200° from S. 45° W. round by the W. and N. to N. 65° E.

These bearings (magnetic) are from the Lighthouse.

The light-tower, keeper's cottages, and store-room are painted white.
