PROCLAMATION

HEREAS by "The Cattle Diseases Ordinance, 1865," the Governor in certain cases, with the advice of the Executive Council, may prohibit by Proclamation the importation and landing of Cattle, subject to restrictions and regulations to be published in the Government Gazette; And whereas by "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," the Governor may make regulations for carrying out the proviin the 43rd year of Her Majesty, No. 23, "The Cattle Diseases Ordinance, 1865," and "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," were made appli-cable to all Horses, Stock, Goats, Mules, Asses, Dogs, Swine, and were to be construed together with the recited Act; And whereas by such last recited Act additional powers are given to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to prohibit by Proclamation the introduction into the Colony, either by sea or land, of any Cattle within the meaning of the said Acts, or any or either of them, from any country or place, or to permit such introduction by land to be made at such inland places, or their importation by sea at such parts of the Sea Coast in Western Australia being ports within the meaning of the Laws of the Customs for the time being, subject to such restrictions and regulations as to the Governor shall seem fit: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the powers so vested in me, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that no horses shall be landed in or imported into the Colony, except in accordance with, and subject to, the restrictions and regulations to be published in the *Government Gazette*, as required by the provisions of the said enactments.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the said Colony, this tenth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and eightytwo.

REGULATIONS.

1. No imported horse or horses shall be landed at any port in the Colony until the same shall be examined by an inspector and a permit granted by him for the landing.

2. On the arrival of any imported horse or horses, notice must be at once given to the Resident Magistrate by the consignee or importer.

3. Any imported horse or horses found to be infected shall be quarantimed at one or other of the reserves set apart in the *Government Gazettes* of 29th February, 1876, 10th October, 1876, and 10th September, 1878 (Reserves, Fremantle, Nos. 207 and 234, Cossack, No. 314).

4. Any imported horse or horses on arrival may be subjected to quarantine for a period not exceeding fourteen days, and any horse in which any infectious disease shall declare itself during such period shall be liable to be detained in quarantine beyond such period of fourteen days until such horse shall be declared clean and free of disease. 5. Any imported horse or horses landed contrary to any of these regulations, or taken or removed from any quarantine station, may be seized by any person and handed over to an Inspector to be disposed of as the Governor may direct.

6. All horses brought within the quarantine stations or straying within the same shall be taken and shall be duly placed in such quarantine and shall be subject to all the provisions of these regulations.

The owner of any horse or horses shall be liable for any expenses that may be incurred in respect to such horse or horses.

The owner or person in charge of any 8. horse which may be affected with any infec-tious or contagious disease shall forthwith report the same to the Chief Police Officer of the district, and such owner or person in charge will be required to carry out all such orders, instructions, and precautionary measures for preventing the spread of the contagion as the police, acting under the orders of the Government, may direct.

9. Any person knowingly or wilfully dis-obeying, contravening, or omitting to observe any of these regulations or orders shall, on conviction before any two Justices, be liable to a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds.
