*Admiralty Survey, Western Australia,
15th February, 1882.*

BEAVER REEF, reported to be in latitude 32° 08' S. and longitude 114° 32' E., has been searched for in vain by H. M. S. "Meda" for nine working days. A space of ten miles North, South, and West, and twenty-five miles East of the position of the supposed rock has been examined.

During the course of the examination discolored water was constantly reported with well-defined blue water around it; this, on examination, proved to be animalcule (commonly called "Whale's Feed") with no bottom at a hundred to four hundred fathoms of line.

It is probable that the discoloration of the water in conjunction with a heavy tide-rip has given rise to the reported danger.

It may therefore be considered that the "Beaver Reef" does not exist in the position assigned to it.
