RIVOLI BAY.

(1) BEACHPORT-ALTERATIONS IN JETTY LIGHT.

The Government of South Australia has given notice, that on 1st September, 1881, the following alterations would be made in the light exhibited on the jetty at Beachport, northern side of Rivoli Bay:--

The temporary red light previously shown from the north end of the jetty is discontinued; and in lieu thereof a fixed *ved* light is now exhibited from the south end—this light is elevated 10 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of about 5 miles.

Note.—Vessels approaching Beachport at night, after passing Penguin Island at the distance of about half a mile, should not steer towards the jetty until the red light bears N.W. by N.

PORT PHILLIP.

(2) DESTRUCTION OF SWAN SPIT LIGHTHOUSE.

The Government of Victoria has given notice, that on 14th September, 1831, Swan Spit Lighthouse, Port Phillip, was totally destroyed by collision—and that until the light is replaced, a light-vessel would be moored in the position of the black buoy (one cable E.N.E. of the site of the lighthouse), from which is exhibited a fixed *red* light, visible in clear weather from a distance of 8 miles.

PORT WESTERN-EASTERN ENTRANCE.

(3) GRIFFITH POINT LIGHT-ALTERATION IN COLOR. Also, dated 30th August, 1881, that the following alteration has been made in the color of the light exhibited on the jetty at Griffith Point, east side of Eastern entrance to Port Western :--

The light is a fixed *green* light instead of fixed white as previously, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of two to three miles.

AUSTRALIA-SOUTH COAST.

(1) SIGNALS USED BY DREDGERS.

(1) SIGNALS USED BY DREDGERS. The Government of South Australia has given Notice, that on and after 6th October 1881, the following signals would be shown from the Dredgers at work in that Colony, in lieu of those previously used.— During the day—inward bound—a red ball denotes leave the Dredger on the starboard hand. A black ball denotes leave the Dredger on the port hand when passing. At night—inward bound—a red light under a white light de-notes leave the Dredger on the starboard hand. A green light under a white light denotes leave the Dredger on the port hand when passing.

SPENCER GULF-HARDWICKE BAY.

(2) FIXED LIGHT AT PORT VICTORIA.

Also, that on 1st October 1881, a light would be exhibited from the extremity of the jetty at Port Victoria, Hardwicke Bay. The light is a *fixed* white light, visible in clear weather from a distance of about 5 miles. Position, lat. 34° 29′ 45″ S. long. 137° 28′ 40″ E. Nore.—This light shows directly over Eclipse rock.

SOUTH-WEST PACIFIC-NEW CALEDONIA.

SOUTH-WEST PACIFIC—NEW CALEDONIA. (4) LEADING LIGHT ON AMEDEE ISLET. With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 97 (3), of 16th June 1881, on the intended exhibition of a leading light from a lighthouse erected on Amédée islet, within Bulari pass, south coast of New Caledonia .--The French Government has given further Notice, that on 1st September 1881, the light was exhibited :--The light is a fixed red light of the fourth order, elevated 47 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 5 miles. The lighthouse consists of a foundation of masonry (29 feet above low water level), octagonal in shape and of a white color surmounted by an ion column 20 feet in height. NOTE.—This light kept in line with the old light (fixed white) bearing N. 394 E. leads in mid-channel through the northern Bulari passage.

Dearing N. 394 E. leads in mid-channel through the horthern Bulari passage. In order to maintain the deepest water, vessels should keep the red light open a little northward of the white light—and with a heavy sea, should avoid opening it to the southward of the white light.

T is hereby notified, for general information, that the Regulations for the Management of the Public Jetties at Perth and Fremantle, published on the 24th June, 1857, and reprinted hereunder, are still in force for the Management of the Perth, and North or River Jetty at Fremantle.

Regulations for the Management of the Public Jetties at Perth and Fremantle, in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinance 19th Vic., No. 15.

1. No vessel or boat shall be fastened to any part of the Public Jetties at Perth and Fremantle, except to such ring bolts or other fastenings as are, or may be, expressly provided for the purpose; and, no vessel or boat shall lie alongside such Jetties, unless so fastened. All cargo boats, vessels, or flats so fastened, shall also be anchored in such a manner as to relieve the Jetties as much as possible from weight of such craft.

2. No vessel or boat shall be so fastened except for the purpose of loading or unloading, or for any longer period than shall be reasonably required for such purpose.

3. Passenger boats only shall be allowed alongside of the steps, on either Jetties, and for no longer period than may be necessary to embark or disembark passengers.

4. No Vessel, Cargo Boat, or Flat shall make fast, or lie alongside the Perth and Fremantle Jetties for the purpose of discharging or taking in cargo, after sunset or before daylight.

5. The N.W. side of the Perth Jetty shall be appropriated to the use of Steamers carrying passengers; and no Cargo Boat shall discharge there, or anchor within 100 yards of that side of the said Jetty.

6. Cargo or other vessels or boats lying at the North or River Jetty at Fremantle shall, on the approach of a Passenger Steamer, haul off to a sufficient distance to enable her to disembark or embark passengers.

7. No fishing nets to be hung or spread about any part of the Jetties; no fishing off the Jetties permitted on Sunday, and, at other times, with only a rod and line. 8. No stone, bricks, clay, sand, lime, firewood, timber in logs, try-pots, cannon or ships' anchors to be loaded or unloaded on the Jetties; firewood may be carted on the Jetties for the use of Passenger Steamers, but taken direct from the cart to the vessel.

9. All goods to be removed from the Jetties before sunset.

10. No bullock teams shall be driven on the Jetties.

11. No gunpowder shall be landed or left on the Jetties without a Keeper, nor without being well covered with a Tarpaulin.

12. No goods shall be landed on the Jetties on Sunday, except in cases of extreme emergency, the permission of the Police Magistrate of Perth or Fremantle being first obtained.

13. No stones, or any kind of substance whatever, shall be thrown into the water from the Jetties or boats lying alongside of them.

14. No fire or fires shall be made on or near any Jetty.
