Turtle Dove Shoal, of doubtful position, has been searched for in the surveying schooner "Meda," with the following result:—A bank of about 2 miles in extent, with depths varying from 5 to 12 fathoms, coral and sand bottom (plainly visible at latter depth), was found at about 2 miles eastward of the reported position of breakers said to have been seen by several coasting vessels.

The shoal lies at about $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles within the 100 fathom edge of the coast bank of soundings; and the shoalest spot found (5 fathoms) is situated in latitude $29^{\circ} 21\frac{1}{2}'$ S., longitude $114^{\circ} 11\frac{1}{2}'$ E. It lies S.S.E., distant 25 miles from the south extreme of Pelsart island (Wreck point), and S.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ S., distant 40 miles from Moore point lighthouse (Champion bay).

There are depths of 47 and 49, 37, and 39 fathoms at the distance of half-a-mile westward, southward, and eastward of the shoal, respectively.

Heavy breakers were seen from the "Meda" near the position of the shoalest water found. But on the following day when at anchor on

the shoal, and when crossing the 5 fathom patch, in the vessel, no breakers (but high rollers) were seen. Shoaler water, therefore, than 5 fathoms may exist on *Turtle Dove shoal*.

Pelsart Bank has depths varying from 18 to 30 fathoms, with a bottom of coarse sand, mixed with broken coral and shells; and is 5 miles long in a N.N.W. and S.S.E. direction, and 2 miles wide.

The shoalest spot found (18 fathoms) is situated in latitude 29° 27' S., longitude 114° 14' E.; and lies S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., distant 6 miles from *Turtle Dove shoal*. There are depths of 40 and 60, 36, and 35 fathoms close westward, southward, and eastward of the bank, respectively; and from 37 to 39 fathoms, coarse sand, mixed with broken coral, between it and *Turtle Dove shoal*.

From the high swell experienced when crossing the bank in the "Meda," it is conjectured that considerably less water than 18 fathoms exists on *Pelsart bank*.

Clio Breakers were reported to have been seen (1872) at about 5 miles N.N.E. of the above given position of *Turtle Dove shoal*. The search for this reported danger (together with the *Turtle Dove of Van Keulen*), in the "Meda," was relinquished on account of bad weather.

Clio breakers and *Turtle Dove shoal* may be identical. But from indications obtained in the "Meda," it is not improbable that other banks exist between *Turtle Dove shoal* and *Houtman rocks*.

These shoals and banks lie directly in the track of vessels between Fremantle and Champion bay. Caution is therefore necessary when navigating in their vicinity.

HIS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, for general information, that a despatch has been received from the Government of India, stating that Waler horses for Army purposes will be purchased during the year 1882-83, to the number and conditions, as follows:—

At Madras One hundred,
,, Calcutta Seventy-five.

Except under special circumstances, purchases will be made only between the 15th September and 28th February.

Horses and mares of all breeds will be received, but they must be within the prescribed age, 4 to 7 years, except as regards country breds. It is to be distinctly understood that in regard to classes I and III remounts three years old and mares in foal will not be purchased.

After the expiration of three (3) years from the 21st June, 1879, greys will not be purchased for Horse or Field Artillery.

The average price for a remount has been fixed at Rupees five hundred and fifty (Rs. 550). Every horse presented for purchase will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given, provided that the average of the purchases does not exceed that limit.
