CORNY POINT Lighthouse is visible inside of the Webb Rock, and unless the night be clear, and the land in sight, might (in the absence of bearings) be mistaken for the true light.

Masters of ships bound to the Northern Ports in Spencer Gulf should not bring Corny Point to bear to the northward of N.E. ½ E. magnetic, until certain of being past Webb Rock.

When coming from the southward the reflected light from the lighthouse may, in clear weather, be observed about 10 miles off, inside a bearing of N.E. ½ N. This inside passage should never be attempted at night by a sailing vessel unless with a fair wind and the master is thoroughly conversant with the coast.
