Perth Poor House, July 22nd, 1882.

SIR,-I have the honor to report having, on the 8th of June, visited and inspected the Protestant Orphanage for boys on the Swan. Number of Government inmates, 29; maintained by private funds, 4; total number 33.

The children were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking.

The food supplied them is good in quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants.

they are allowed sufficient for their wants. The dormitories were clean and well ventilated. June 13th.—Visited and inspected the Perth Protestant Orphanage for girls. Number of Govern-ment inmates, 28; infant boys, 6; maintained by private funds, 2; total number 36. They were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking, and appeared well fed and treated. The food supplied them is good in quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants.

", Their health during the past quarter has been good, and their conduct satisfactory. They attend school, which is conducted on the premises, under the superintendence of the matron, Miss Duffield; they also assist in the routine work of the institution.

The dormitories were clean and well ventilated.

The same day I visited and inspected the Native and Half-Caste Mission, Perth. Number of boys, 7; girls, 13; total number, 20.

There has been no sickness amongst the inmates during the past quarter, and their conduct continues

The dormitories were clean and well ventilated. The provisions supplied to the children are good, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants.

The children were clean, neatly clothed, and

healthy looking. June 30th.—Visited and inspected the Roman Catholic Orphanage for boys at Subiaco. Number of Government inmates, 52; maintained by private funds, 12; total number 64.

funds, 12; total number 64. They were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking, and appeared well fed and treated. Their health during the past quarter has been good, and their conduct satisfactory. The food supplied, with the exception of the bread, is of good quality, and the children are allowed sufficient for their wants. With proceed to the bread it was very dark and

With reference to the bread, it was very dark and not of good quality. The Very Rev. Father Gibney, V.G., Manager, who was present, informed me the flour from which the bread was made was supplied by a firm in Adelaide as Fine Flour, and under a now pending against them for breach of contract; also, that flour had been purchased in Perth for use in the Orphanages, to replace the flour then in use

The children attend school, which is conducted on the premises, under the superintendence of the Sisters of Mercy; they also assist in the routine

Sisters of Mercy; they also assist in the Fourne work of the institution. In connection with the manufacture of Olive Oil at the Orphanage by the boys, referred to by me in a previous report, I have much pleasure in stating that new and improved machinery for extracting the oil has been imported and erected in a commodious building built for the purpose. Also visited and inspected the Roman Catholic Orphanage for girls. Number of Government in-uates, 55; maintained by private funds, 24; total number 79.

They were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking, and appeared well fed and treated. Their health during the past quarter has been good, and their conduct satisfactory.

The food supplied is good, with the exception of the bread, which was rather dark (steps have been taken to remedy this), and the children are allowed sufficient for their wants.

They attend school, which is conducted on the premises, under the superintendence of the Sisters of Mercy; the elder girls also assist in the routine work of the institution.

The dormitories were clean and well ventilated. The water supply at each institution was good.

SOUTH AUSTRALIAN RIFLE VOLUNTEER FORCE.

Custon, S.E., viâ Adelaide, 17th July, 1882.

DEAE SIE,—It will be a surprise, and I am sure a very great disappointment to your Colony, to learn that the negotiations for the simultaneous Intercolonial Rifle Match have ended unsuccessfully as far as Victoria, New South Wales, Queensland, New Zealand, and your old Colony are concerned—the final intimation of which I only received last week. A special meeting of my council will consider the matter on Wødnesday, and probably have wired you the result 'ere receipt of this, which I write rather hastily, having waited till the last moment for a reply from Adelaide from our representatives there. I need not express my regret at this unsatisfactory ending of the scheme, but it is satisfactory to find that your Colony has taken up the idea so warmly. The reasons now advanced against the match by the other colonies, in spite of the promise of support in the earlier period of the negotiations, would take up several sheets, but the majority are frivolous in the extreme—in fact I feel very much annoyed that all did not speak out plainly at the onset. New South Wales especially took up the idea very warmly, but a sudden change of opinion came over them a month or two ago, which apparently spread to the adjoining colonies, and prompted them not to carry out the idea. At the time of receiving the news of the N. S. Welshmen wavering, I had everything arranged for the match, and have since been in communication with nearly all the colonies to bring the match off if possible, but I regret to say with less and less success. Though disappointed I am not disheartened, especially after the example set by the riflemen of your Colony, to whom every praise is due for the trouble they have taken, and I must express my appreciation of their efforts. Our Force is in a state of re-organisation, and for several reasons our Annual Prize Meeting (fixed for the 22nd prox.) is to be postponed till matters are more settled. The sale of ammunition has been stopped in this Colony for some time, owing to the small supply in store and the

I am afraid this Force cannot bring together a team on the 12th prox., but I trust we shall have another contest with you before the end of the year, if only to endeavor to recover lost laurels. I cannot say definitely what decision my council will come to at the meeting on Wednesday, but I can see no other alternative than to postpone the match for a time.
