ROCKS AT ENTRANCE TO MOURILYAN HARBOUR.

CAPTAIN PENNEFATHER, of the Government Schooner "Pearl," reports having found a rock with only 4½ feet of water over it at low-water springs, lying S. ½ E. 60 yards from Goodman Rock, at the entrance to Mourilyan Harbour; and also, other rocks awash at low-water, bearing S.E. and distant 20 world from Goodman Rock, distant 30 yards from Goodman Rock.

The available channel, which is between these dangers, is only 40 yards wide, and must be used with the greatest caution.

The Admiralty Directory, Vol. II., page 234,—from information supplied by Captain Moresby, R.N., of H.M.S. "Basilisk,"—states that the least depth of water in the channel is 28 feet, and that its width is barely 200 yards.
