NOTICE TO MARINERS.

[No. 137.] NEW ZEALAND.

SHOAL IN FOVEAUX STRAIT. Information has been received from the Marine Department, Wellington, New Zealand, that a shoal has been discovered about 4 miles eastward of Ruapuke island, eastern entrance of Foveaux strait. This shoal (Fairchild shoal) has over it a depth of 4 fathoms, rocky bottom, with from 7 to 12 fathoms around, and lies with the following bearings:—

Green island, east extreme ... S.W. by S., distant $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles. Toby rock (awash) ... S.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W., , $\frac{2}{1}$ 2 ,, Dog island lighthouse ... W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., , $\frac{11\frac{1}{2}}{2}$,,

Note.—The breakers formerly charted at 2 miles N.N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. from Toby rock, are considered not to exist, and have been expunged from the Admiralty charts.

(The bearings are Magnetic. Variation 17° Easterly in 1882.)
