HEREAS it is provided by "The Sandalwood Act, 1881," that it shall be a few the Governor in Council from time.

lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim and define one or more area or areas of Waste Lands of the Crown within which no live or growing Sandalwood tree shall be cut or grubbed up for the period to be named by the Governor in such Proclamation; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and define the Waste Lands of the Crown contained and being within the following area, to be an area within which no live or growing Sandalwood tree shall be cut or grubbed up during the period of three years from the date hereof:-

"Starting from Beaufort Bridge on the Perth-Albany Road and extending East by North to Lake Norring; thence North to Wardering Spring; thence North-north-east to Cookine Spring; thence North-north-east to Cookine Spring, passing through Wagolin Spring; thence in a North-north-westerly direction to Nalyaring Rock, and thence to Cow-Cowing; thence in a West-north-westerly direction to the summit of the Wongan Hills, and thence on to Clinch's, on the road from Perth to Geraldton; thence in a Southerly direction along the said road to Guildford; thence South to the Perth-Albany Road at Kelmscott town. to the Perth-Albany Road at Kelmscott townsite, and from thence in a general South-east-erly direction along the said Perth-Albany Road to the starting point."

## IMMIGRATION.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 21st October, 1882.

IS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, for general information, that in order to further develop the system of Nominated Immigration at present in force in this Colony, persons wishing to obtain Free Passages from the United Kingdom for their friends, or such other persons as they may desire to introduce into the Colony, can obtain printed forms of application and all necessary information from the Immigration Officer at Perth, or from the Resident Magistrate of the district in which the applicant resides.

William Felgate, Esq., 27, Clements Lane, London, will continue to act as Emigration

Nominated Emigrants will be required, prior to being furnished with a passage, to sign an agreement to remain three years in the Colony, or refund to the Colonial Government the cost of their passage from England.

Nominated Emigrants who are too poor to pay their expenses to the port of embarkation will, on the production of a Certificate to that effect from the Minister or Constable of the parish in which such Emigrant resides, have their reasonable expenses paid on application to

the Agent.

Persons resident in the Colony wishing to nominate Emigrants through the medium of friends in England may do so by application through the Immigration Officer, Perth; and upon the Emigrant so nominated being recommended to the Agent, a free passage on the usual conditions will be provided.

No charge will be made for mess, kit, or bedding provided for infants under one year

A certain number of single female domestic servants will be introduced annually, and persons requiring this class of servant are requested to communicate with the Immigration Officer, Perth, who will record their applications.

## The Scab Act, 1882.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 20th October, 1882.

IS Excellency the Governor directs that paragraph No. 21 of the Instructions for the guidance of Inspectors of Sheep in the performance of their duties under "The Scab Act, 1882," be rescinded, and the following be substituted in lieu thereof:-

2.-License and Supervision of Cleansing.

21. On application being made to him by the owner of infected sheep, the Inspector will, without owner of infected sheep, the Inspector will, without fee, grant such owner a license in the form of Schedule B hereof, if issued in the months of May or June, for 16 weeks; if issued in the months of July or August, for 12 weeks; if issued in the month of September, for 8 weeks; if issued in the month of October, until 1st December; if issued at any time between 1st November and 1st May, for 6 weeks; and on a like application and payment by the owner of the authorised fees to the Inspector, he may grant a renewed license, also in the form of Schedule B, for a period of eight weeks; and it will be his duty not only to attend and see that the process of not only to attend and see that the process of cleansing such sheep is properly carried out, but also to visit the sheep thus under license at intervals, and especially when the weather is such as would cause the disease, when present, to show itself.

#### AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST.

## SPENCER GULF—CORNY POINT LIGHT—ARC OF REFLECTED LIGHT.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 20 (1), of 4th February, 1882, on the intended exhibition, on 1st March, 1882, of a fixed white light on Corny point, east side of Spencer gulf, which should be visible seaward between the bearings of N. 45° E. and S. 65° W.:—

The Government of South Australia has given further Notice, dated 29th May, 1882, that an arc of reflected light from Corny point lighthouse is visible inshore of Webb rock, and unless the night be clear and the land in sight, might (in the absence of bearings) be mistaken for the true light.

Vessels approaching from the southward, should not bring Corny point lighthouse to bear to the northward of N.E. ½ E., until past Webb rock.

The reflected light may, in clear weather, be seen from a distance of about 10 miles, inside the bearing of N.E. & N.—This inner passage should never be attempted at night by a sailing vessel, unless with a fair wind and thorough knowledge of the coast.

## (2) INTENDED REVOLVING LIGHT ON CAPE BANKS.

Further notice has been given, that on or about 1st January, 1883, the light will be exhibited:

The light will be a revolving light of the second order, showing one red and two white lights at intervals of twenty seconds each, the whole revolution occupying sizty seconds.

The light will be elevated 92 feet above the sea; the white light should be visible in clear weather from a distance of about 10 miles, the red light from about 8 miles.

HEREAS by section thirteen of "The Hawkers Act, 1882," the Colony has been divided, for the purpose of the said Act, into three Districts, designated the Northern, the Central, and the Southern; and whereas by the same section of the said Act it is directed that the limits of the said Districts, as set forth in the sixth schedule of the said Act, shall be published in the Government Gazette, the said limits are hereby published, for general information, viz.:-

> The Northern District shall consist of that portion of the Colony lying North of latitude 23° 28′ South.

> The Central District shall consist of that portion lying between latitude 23° 28′ South and 31° 30′ South.

> The Southern District shall consist of that portion lying between latitude 31° 30′ South and 35° 15′ South.

The Flour to be warranted to keep good for six months after delivery.

Fresh Meat to be delivered daily, when the Government or its representative may consider it practicable, and in proportion of three days' supply of Mutton to four days' supply of Beef per week, or alternate days of each. When Beef is issued, fore and hind quarters, or portions thereof, are to be delivered alternately; six inches at least to be cut off the hough and neck bones. Mutton to be delivered in carcasses, excluding heads, necks, shanks below the knee, and hough joints.

The supplies to be delivered at such places and times as may be required by the Government or persons deputed by it.

The ordinary ration of Vegetables to consist of 1lb. of Potatoes; but when demanded by the Government, and in season, the following equivalents must be supplied twice a week; Pumpkins, 2lbs.; or Turnips, Carrots, or Cabbage, 1½lbs.; or Onions, ¼lb., for every pound of Potatoes.

All supplies must be delivered in good and sound packages; Corn and Flour sacks, and Oil casks, will be returned to the Contractors; other packages will be retained free of charge.

The Contractors will be liable for any expense which may be incurred by the Government in consequence of the non-performance of their contracts.

Payments to be made monthly, and for general supplies for the quantities actually consumed in the month.

No transfer of any Contract will be permitted, without the previous consent of the Government.

Each Tender must bear the bonâ fide signatures of two responsible and approved sureties, who will be required to be bound for the due performance of the Contract, under a penalty of about one-fourth of the estimated sum to be paid under each Contract. Parties are requested to be careful in drawing up their Tenders, which should be in strict conformity with this Notice.
