## KIMBERLEY DISTRICT.

So much of the Colony as lies to the North of the parallel of 19° 30' South Latitude.

### NORTHERN DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the Kimberley District. On the West by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent to it. On the South by a line from the southernmost point of Exmouth Gulf direct to Mount Palgrave, thence due East to the boundary of the Colony; and on the East by the said boundary of the Colony.

### GASCOYNE DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the Northern District. On the West by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent to it. On the South by a due East line from the coast, passing through the summit of Mt. Murchison to the boundary of the Colony; and on the East by the said boundary of the Colony.

### VICTORIA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the Gascoyne District. On the West by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent to it. On the South by a line starting from the sea coast North of Long Island and extending due East, passing through a spot 20 miles North from Dandaraga Spring till it meets a due North line from the summit of Wongan Hills, and from the said summit by a due East line to the East boundary of the Colony; and on the East by the said boundary of the Colony.
