Its Excellency the Administrator has been pleased to direct the publication, for general information, of the Finding of the Court held under the provisions of the 28th Vict., No. 2, on the 2nd day of April, 1883, for the purpose of inquiring into the circumstances connected with the stranding which occurred in the Port of Fremantle on the 21st March, 1883, of the Steam Ship "Macedon," of Melbourne, Victoria.

FINDING.

Read in open Court to Captain Craig, late Master of the S. S. "Macedon," of Melbourne.

WE are of opinion that the charges Nos. 1, 3, 4, 5 have been fully proved, and that the casualty has been occasioned by your default. We therefore feel it our duty to recommend that your Certificate as Master be suspended for three calendar months from the date of the Vessel's loss, viz., 21st March, 1883.
