Perth Poor House, April 9th, 1883.

SIR,—I have the honor to report having, on the 19th March, visited and inspected the Perth Protestant Orphanage for girls. Number of Government inmates, 25; infant boys, 5; maintained by private funds, 4; total number, 34.

The children were clean, healthy looking, and appeared well fed and treated.

The food supplied them is of good quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants.

There has been no sickness amongst them during the quarter, and their conduct has been satisfactory.

They attend school, which is conducted on the premises, and also assist in the routine work of the Institution.

The same day I visited and inspected the Roman Catholic Orphanage for girls. Number of Government inmates, 54; maintained by private funds, 23; total number, 77.

The children were clean, healthy looking, and appeared well fed and treated.

Their health during the quarter has been good, and their conduct satisfactory.

The food supplied them is of good quality, and they are not stinted.

They attend school, which is conducted on the premises, and also assist in the routine work of the Institution.

The same day I visited and inspected the Native and Half-caste Mission. Number of boys, S; girls, 13; total number, 21.

The children were clean and healthy looking, and ap-peared well fed and treated; there has been no sickness amongst them during the quarter, and their conduct continues good.

The food supplied them is of good quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants.

March 21st .-- Visited and inspected the Swan Protestant Orphanage for boys. Number of Government inmates, 27; maintained by private funds, 4; total number, 31.

The children were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking, and appeared well fed and treated.

The food supplied them is good in quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants.

Their health during the quarter has been good, and their conduct satisfactory.

March 30th.—Visited and inspected the Roman Catholic Orphanage for boys at Subiaco. Number of Government inmates, 56; maintained by private funds, 8; total number, 64.

They were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking, and appeared well fed and treated.

There has been no sickness amongst them during the quarter, and their conduct continues satisfactory.

They attend school, which is conducted on the premises; they also assist in the routine work of the Institution.

The food supplied to them is of good quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants.

The dormitories at each Institution were clean and well ventilated.

SOLOMON ISLANDS.

The following information, relating to the Solomon islands, has been received from Lieutenant Frederick Elton, H.M.S. Diamond, Captain Alfred T. Dale, 1882.*

All Bearings are Magnetic. Variation in 1882, 8° 6' E. **MALAYTA ISLAND.**—The bay upon the north-east coast in latitude 5° 45' S., longitude 161° E., is about 8 to 10 miles wide from cape Arsacides to the point forming the South limit. A large low island of a horse-shoe shape, the concave side to the S.S.W., and from the extremities of which reefs extend about half a mile, is situated nearly in the centre of the bay. Between this island and the land at the head of the bay there are several reefs and shoal patches easily discernible from aloft when the sun is in a favourable position, but no dangers were seen from the masthead to the north of the island, and no anchorage was found around it except for small vessels. **QUI and QUAHQUAHROO HARBOURS** t lie about 3 miles westward of the above mentioned island, and may be identified by the two small islands, Qui and Rongahseayah. **Qui harbour** affords accommodation for two or three large vessels,

Qui harbour affords accommodation for two or three large vessels, the water shoaling gradually from 26 fathoms in the centre to the immediate vicinity of the reefs.

Quahquahroo harbour is merely an arm of Qui harbour, and is suitable for small vessels only.

At the northern part of Malayta island, a low thickly wooded island fringed with coral reefs; lies about 2 miles from the shore off cape Simson, and several small islets were seen near the mainland to the south-eastward.

FLORDA ISLAND,—Gaieta village, —At about half a cable S.S.E. of Flat-top rock, off Gaieta village, is a coral patch not easily seen, upon which 3 fathoms least water was found.

A larger shoal and more easily discernible, upon which 33 fathoms least water was found, lies about a quarter of a mile west of Flat-top rock.

Anchorage. -- The Diamond found temporary anchorage, the day being calm, in 17 fathoms, coral and sand, in a small bay westward of Flat-

liana.‡

Sandity Passage.—Anchorage.—The Diamond moored, head and stern, in 17 fathoms, mud, off the village of Nago, in a small harbour, the approach to which is narrow but deep, near the middle of the south shore of Sandity passage.

Directions.—To find this obscure anchorage when entering Sandfly passage from the south-westward, keep mid-channel until a well-defined conical hill, with a rounded knoll to seaward of it, is seen to form the north-east boundary of a comparatively deep bay. Enter this bay with the conical hill upon the port hand, pass between some coral reefs and patches easily seen with the sun astern, proceed to the extreme head of the bay, and anchor. Tides.—Along the southern coast of Florida island, the flood stream was found to run to the westward.

Eddies and rips were observed to cover much space between Florida and Guadalcanar islands, these eddies having the appearance of shallow water render the shoals more difficult to distinguish.

water render the shoals more difficult to distinguish. **BUSSEL ISLANDS.**—Anchorage.—In passing through the central channel of these islands, anchorage was found in a small inlet, about midway, upon the eastern shore in 20 fathoms, mud and coral, with just room to swing; in latitude 9° 4' S., longitude 159° 74' E. Anchorage was obtained at the head of an inlet in latitude 9° 2' S., longitude 159° 5' E., to the south-east of Nono island in 23 fathoms, with swinging room.

No anchorage could be found in Paddy bay, south of Kobiloko island. Gurrent.—The *Diamond* found a current setting to the southward one knot per hour, in the channel between Guadalcanar and San Christoval islands upon each of the three occasions of her visit.

TASMANIA-NORTH COAST.

TAMAR RIVER ENTRANCE.

(1) PORT DALRYMPLE-LEADING LIGHTS AT SHE-OAK POINT.

The lights are fixed white lights, placed 400 yards apart, and when kept in line bearing S.E. by E. h E. lead through the West channel, Tamar river entrance. The lights should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 9 miles.

The upper light, elevated 55 feet above high water, is visible between the bearings of N.N.W., through north and east, to S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. The lower light, elevated 38 feet above high water, is visible between the bearings of N. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., through north and east, and S.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E.

(2) NON-EXISTENCE OF SUNKEN DANGER SOUTH-EAST-WARD OF DUGDALE ROCK.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 172 (1), of 2nd September, 1882, on the reported existence of a sunken danger lying about one mile south-eastward of Dugdale rock, Inner Route, between capes Sidmouth and Direction:--

The Queensland Government has given further Notice, dated 17th October, 1852—on the authority of the Commander of the Government schoner *Pearl*, who had carefully examined the locality, without dis-covering any sign of its existence—that the danger reported was probably Dugdale rock itself. The sunken danger therefore has been removed from the Admiralty charts.

AUSTRALIA-WEST COAST.

UNSUCCESSFUL SEARCH FOR BEAVER REEF.

The following information has been received from Staff Commander Coghlan, Admiralty Surveying Officer, dated 21st October 1882, relative to a further unsuccessful search made in the Colonial Government surveying schooner Mcda for the Beaver reef, said to be situated about 60 miles westward of Swan river:---

This rest was reported by the schoner *Beaver* in the year 1864, to be in lat. 32° of S., long. 114^o 37' E., and subsequently reported by the schoner *Gift* in 1869 (about 11' miles west of that position), to break heavily, and to extend about half a mile in a north and south direction with depths of 15 to 18 fathoms at the distance of a quarter of a mile from the southern end.

During this further examination by the Meda, extending over a period of eleven days, soundings with no bottom at 360 fathoms and no bottom at 300 fathoms were obtained at the positions given, and no bottom at 850 fathoms about midway between.
