CIRCULAR.

Downing Street, 6th March, 1883.

STR,—With reference to Lord Carnarvon's Circular Despatch of the 2nd of February, 1877, I have the honor to transmit to you, for information and publication in the Colony under your government, a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council modifying the Order in Council of the 30th of September, 1873, respecting the Tonnage Measurement of Italian Vessels in this country.

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

W HEREAS by the Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862, it is enacted that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships for the time being in force under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, therein called the Principal Act, have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by Order in Council to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their cer-tificates of registry or other national papers, and thereupon it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be remeas-ured in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions, but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted on their certificates of registry or other papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry of British ships is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships:

And whereas Her Majesty, by Order in Council dated the 30th day of September 1873, was pleased to direct that 30th day of September 1873, was pleased to direct that merchant sailing and steam ships belonging to the King-dom of Italy the measurement whereof had, after the first day of July one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such ships, testified by the dates thereof, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their product on their product and papers of the tonnage denoted in their registers or other national papers, in the same manner, and to the same extent and for the same purposes in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships; provided nevertheless, that if the owner or master of any Italian steam ship should desire the deduction for engine room in such ship to be estimated under the rules for engine room measurement and deduction applicable to British ships instead of under the Italian rule, the engine room should be measured and the deduction calculated according to the British rules :

And whereas the Government of His Majesty the King of Italy have by Royal Decree dated the 30th day of July 1882, modified the rules for engine room measurement and deduction applicable to Italian steam ships, and the said modified rules are now the same as those in force under the said principal Act, and came into operation in the said kingdom of Italy on the 21st day of September 1882:

HER MAJESTY is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to direct that the steam ships of Italy, the certificates of Italian nationality and registry of which are dated on or after the 21st day of September 1882, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in the said certifi-cates of Italian nationality and registry.

The following information relating to certain shoals on the east coast of Australia and in Torres Strait has been received from various authorities, 1882.

(All Bearings are Magnetic. Variation in 1883).
 Solitary islands, 9° E. Trinity bay, 6° E. Torres Strait, 4³⁰ E.
 SOLITARY ISLANDS.—Shoals.—Two shoal patches, with breakers, have been seen respectively, one mile, and half a mile, distant in a northerly direction from worth-west rock of the north Solitary islands.*

MOURLYAN HARBOUR, —A rock with 4½ feet over it at low water, has been found in the entrance to Mourilyan harbour; from it Good-man rock bears N. 4 W., distant 60 yards. Other rocks, awash at low water, were found with Goodman rock bearing N.W., distant 30 yards. The available channel is only 40 yards wide, and must be used with

the greatest caution.+

TRINITY BAY.—Corea Shoal.—This shoal, lying about $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles southward of the Wentworth reef, Trinity bay, is stated to be about one cable in extent, with 4 to 6 feet water over it at low water; from it white cliffs bear S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., Harris peak S.W. by S., and Island point N.W. $\frac{3}{2}$ W. $\frac{1}{2}$

MARGARET BAY.—Sand Bank.—A sand bank with 3 feet over it at low water has been found in Margaret buy; from it the northern ex-tremity of cape Grenville bears E. by S. § S. Centre of Sunday island N. by W. distant one mile.

This bank, though out of the main navigation, is a danger to vessels seeking anchorage in Margaret bay, or working along the coast under shelter of cape Grenville.

TORRES STRAIT.—Jacobus Sheals.—The commander of the Imperial German vessel-of-war Moeve reports, that, upon passing Arden island, the east Jacobus sheal was recognised by the breakers upon it. The west Jacobus sheal was seen at the same time.¶

[No. 30.] AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST. SPENCER GULF. REVOLVING LIGHT ON LOWLY POINT.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 42 (3), of 4th March 1882, and No. 288 (2), of 29th December 1882, on intended exhibition, on or about 1st December 1882, of a revolving light from a lighthouse to be erected on Lowly point, western side of entrance to Port Augusta; and that owing to unavoidable circumstances, the lighthouse being erected on Lowly point would not be ready for exhibition of the light before February 1883:--

The Government of South Australia has given further Notice, that on 1st February 1883, the light will be exhibited :— The light will be a *revolving* white light, showing a *bright flash overy* ten seconds, clevated 57 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles.

The illuminating apparatus will be holophotal, or by reflectors, of the third order.

The lighthouse, two cottages and store, are painted white.

NORTH ISLAND-HAURAKI GULF.

(1) MOKO HINOU ISLANDS—INTENDED FLASHING LIGHT ON BURGESS ISLET, AND SECTOR OF RED LIGHT FROM TIRI TIRI LIGHTHOUSE.

The Government of New Zealand has given Notice, that about the month of April, 1883, it is anticipated that a light will be ready for exhibition from a lighthouse in course of erection on Burgess islet, Moko Himou islands, northern entrance to Hauraki gulf. The light will be a *flashing* white light of the first order, showing a

flash every ten seconds.

Position, lat. 35deg. 55min. 15sec. S., long. 175deg. 8min. 45sec. E.

Also, that on the exhibition of the above light, a sector of red light will be shown from Tiri Tiri island lighthouse, extending through an are of about 23deg., from over Flat rock towards Kawau island.

Further particulars concerning these lights, with date of exhibition, will be given in due course.

MIDDLE ISLAND.

(2) HOKITIKA RIVER ENTRANCE-GREEN LIGHT INDICATING CHANNEL.

The following information relating to Tonga, Wallis, and Samoan islands has been received from various authorities, 1879-1882 :---

TONGA or FRIENDLY ISLANDS. a

NUKALOFA, Shoals.—Captain H. Reade, of the German ship Confluentia, reports the existence of several shoals, having 3 to 10 feet water upon them, lying 3 miles west of Mallenoah island, or nearly in the fairway to the anchorage off Nukalofa. Also, that a patch with one fathom over it lies distant 4 4-10ths miles west of Mallenoah island; it is marked by a red buoy.

A shoal of 21 fathoms lies E.S.E. distant 2 miles from Attataa island. A patch with 4 feet over it, lies nearly midway between the Juno shoal and Augusta rock, it is marked by a red buoy.

Off Mafanga village, and about half a mile from the shore, is a shoal 3 fathoms, marked by a white buoy.

Amargura island.—A reef is said to extend under water half-a-mile in an easterly direction from this island.

UEA or WALLIS ISLANDS.

UEA or WALLIS ISLANDS consist of one principal island and several smaller islands and islets surrounded by a barrier reef, through which there is only one channel (the southern one) available for large vessels, b

Usa, the largest island, is 197 feet high near the centre, and covered with vegetation. It is divided into three parishes, Mua upon the South, Lano upon the North, and Matautui upon the East. The town of Matautui is the capital, and residence of the native queen.

Population.—The population of 1879 numbered 3,500, all converted to Christianity by the Mariste missionaries : they possess a small armed force, who manceuvre in European style, and are provided with muskets.

Supplies.—Pigs and poultry may be readily obtained, also ya bananas, and kava-root; cocoanuts are abundant. Water is scarce. also yams,

Winds and Weather.—During the months of June, July, and August, the prevailing winds are between E.S.E. and N.N.E. Breezes from the North or N.N.W. are accompanied with squalls and rain.

Tides.—It is high water, full and change, at 6h. 40m.; springs rise 6 feet. In the bay of Matautui the tide ebbs 8 hours, and flows 4 hours. The sea washing over the barrier reef sometimes makes the tide irregular.

Houlkulu Pass.—The southern opening in the barrier reef, leading into Allier Bay, is practicable for a steamer, but sailing vessels should not enter, unless with a fair wind, and upon the first of the flood tide. The channel is easily recognised, being west of Fenua-fu island, the south island of the group, the fringing reef of which extends about one cable westward, and forms the eastern side of the Pass. Upon the west side of the Pass, the wreck of L'Hermitte will be seen.

birections.—Having arrived off the Pass at low water, brin gthe south-east point of Nukuatea island to bear N.N.E., and open to the west-ward of Fenua-fu island, which mark will lead in. Care should be taken to give the north point of Fenua-fu island a berth of at least 1½ cables. Upon the ebb tide there are strong eddies, which must be crossed with speed, and borrowing upon the western side of the Pass, both upon entering and leaving; upon the flood tide the eddies are scarcely noticeable.

The tide has been reported to run in the Pass at the rate of 8 knots an hour, but recent observations give a maximum of 6 knots, slack water lasts about 15 minutes.

Pilots.—Native pilots from Mua will board the vessel off Houikulu Pass, too much confidence must not be placed in them, for they are unaccustomed to large vessels. The reafs can be seen from aloft under favourable circumstances, with the sum astern. The charge for pilot-age is 10 plastres cach way, whatever tonnage the ship may be.

Nukuatea island, is high, rugged, and conspicuous.

Nuku Akimoa (Sail Rock) is remarkable, and has the appearance of a vessel under sail.

Faica island bounding the eastern side of Allier bay, is one of the largest of the group, it is low and covered with coconnuts.

Allier bay.—Anchorage.—When bound for this anchorage and well within the Houikulu Pass, steer for the north point of Faioa island; when Sail rock bears N. $\frac{3}{4}$ W., and the south point of Nukuatea island W.S.W., anchor in 22 fathoms, sand and coral. This anchorage is, however, inconveniently far from the shore.

Mua anchorage.—There are two channels to this anchorage, one to the east, the other to the west of Nuku Akimoa. The Commander of the Vaudreuil recommends the eastern one.

Eastern channel.—Directions.—Steer as directed for the anchorage in Allier bay, until the west point of Nuku Fetau bears N.N.W., when the channel between the banks extending eastward from Nuku Akimoa, and a reef with one fathom over it will be seen, the most favourable time being in the forenocn.

The channel first takes a W.N.W. direction, and when the west point of Nuku Fetau bears N. $\frac{3}{4}$ W., steer for it until Nuku Akimoa bears S.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ S.; then alter course N.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ N. for the anchorage in 8 fathoms, sand; with Mua steeple (a dark colored stone tower among the trees) bearing N.W. by N., distant one mile from Mua village. Landing is difficult at low water.

Matautui.—Anchorage.—There is anchorage off Matautui village which can be reached by an intricate channel (in which the tide runs 4 knots) from Allier bay, near the north extreme of the Faioa island.

A local pilot and a good look-out from aloft are the best guides, the weather should be clear and the sun in the south-east.

Landing is easy at high water, a little north of the church.

Two miles north of Matautui the channel is completely obstructed by sand banks.

SAMOAN OR NAVIGATOR ISLANDS.

SAVAII ISLAND.—Falelima, —There is no anchorage at Falelima, upon the west coast of Savaii island. There is, however, a boat harbour, but landing is possible only at high water. d

Safoone Road affords anchorage in 13 fathoms during the south-east winds, but there is usually much swell. There are two boat passages to the shore through the barrier reef; the western one is the best, although fathest from the settlement. If there is much swell, the eastern passage is practicable at high water only.

UPOLU ISLAND, -- Apia Harbour, -- When sighting Apia, some houses with red roofs are prominent objects. They are situated well up the hill side and can be seen before the town or shipping.

Saluafata Harbour, situated in a bay, 9 miles east of Apia, is about half-a-mile square, protected from the swell by coral reefs, through which the channel is 2 cables wide. The western side of the bay is occupied by a reef 3 to 7 cables from the shore, upon which are two small islets, and having a boat passage inshore of it. e

Beacon.—A pyramidal beacon, having a triangular shaped head and painted white, has been erected upon Ariadne point, 114 feet above the see. It shows well against the wooled hills behind it, and serves as a mark for recognising the harbour. *j*

Anchorage in 6 to 7 fathoms, fine sand, will be obtained about 2 cables S.S.E. of the castern of two small islets before-mentioned; the western part of the harbour is preferable, as being the most sheltered.

Pilots.—A native pilot can be obtained at Saluafata.

Supplies.—Fish, fowls, and eggs can be obtained in small quantities; oranges and coccanuts are abundant. Cattle may be procured from Messrs. Godeffroy's plantation, about 5 miles distant upon the coast, and if it be expedient to keep them alive, good pasturage will be found upon the shores of the bay.

Water may be obtained from a stream situated in the south-west part of the harbour.

Landing.—The best landing is at the village of Fusi in the south part of the bay, through a small opening in the fringing reef 40 feet wide.

Natives of Saluafata are friendly and obliging.

FANGALOA BAY, upon the north-east coast of Upolu, is an inlet $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles in length, N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. and S.W. $\frac{1}{3}$ W., one mile wide between the entrance points, midway between which the depth is 56 fathoms, decreasing gradually to 6 fathoms at the head of the bay. The shores are fringed by coral reefs extending from one to $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables from the coast, the outer edges of which dry at low water. g

A detached shoal, having 14 feet water over it, is reported to lie N.W. by N., distant 34 cables from Lena village upon the south shore.

NAUTILUS BANK, upon which there is a depth of 9 fathoms, lies with Mount Apia bearing W. by S., Mount Fao S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., and Albatross island (in Saluafata harbour) bearing S.S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. h

FALEALILI HARBOUR, upon the south coast of Upolo, is sheltered from northerly winds only, and is very small. The entrance is difficult to recognise, narrow, and obstructed by outlying reefs. i
