SIR,—I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of Sir William Robinson's Despatch No. 43, of the 6th ultimo, reporting that he left Perth on the 3rd of February, and had arrived at Albany en route to Adelaide; and enclosing addresses presented to him on his departure from Western Australia.

SIR,—I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of Sir William Robinson's Despatches Nos. 48 and 53, of the 9th and 13th of February respectively, and of your Despatch No. 55, of the 16th of February, reporting your assumption of the Government.

You will, as instructed by my Despatch to Sir W. Robinson, No. 23 of the 9th of February, continue to administer the Government until relieved by Mr. Broome, and as your title to administer the Government depends upon your tenure of the Chief Justiceship, it will not be possible for your successor to be sworn in until that office is vacated by

Should Mr. Onslow arrive sooner he will resume his office of Attorney General, or become a Judge provisionally, as may be found to be most convenient.

I have to convey to you my approval of the appointment of Mr. Stone to be a provisional Judge of the Supreme Court under "The Supreme Court Act, 1880," and of the appointment of Mr. G. W. Leake to be Attorney General in the place of Mr. Stone.

Should Mr. Onslow and Mr. Hensman both be in the Colony before Your Administration closes, I have no doubt that both these gentlemen and Mr. Stone will cordially assist you in making whatever arrangements are most in the interest of the Public Service, for discharging the duties of Judge, Attorney General, and Crown Solicitor, during the few days for which provision will be required.

Sir.—Adverting to the previous correspondence with reference to the question whether Certificates of Competency issued to Masters by the Government of Western Australia are available beyond the limits of that Colony, and especially to your letter, dated the 24th March, 1882, in which you state that there is nothing in your Acts to show that a Master holding such a Certificate may take a ship outside the limits of the Colony, I have now the honor to forward for your information an extract from this Board's Regulations for the examination of Masters, Mates, and Engineers, showing the British possessions that, by the Order in Council, are entitled to issue Certificates of Competency of the same force as those granted by the Board of Trade. From this date inclusive no Certificates other than those referred to will be recognised in this Colony, and I am therefore to inform you that, as Western Colony, and I am therefore to inform you that, as western Australia is not included in the list, vessels arriving here from your Colony, the Masters of which possess only a Certificate of Competency issued by your Government, will be liable to detention, and the inconvenience and expense consequent thereon. The Board thought that you would like to be made acquainted with this regulation, to enable you—should you deem it necessary or desirable—either to advise owners and masters of ships of the risk they run, or to prevent Officers, certificated in the manner referred to, from proceeding in charge of ships beyond the limits authorised by your Ordinances for the use of such Certificates. ficates.

NEW CUTTING AND PROPOSED ALTERATION OF LIGHTS AT THE BAR OF THE RIVER BRISBANE.

TOWARDS the latter end of May, it is expected that the straight cutting across the Bar of the Brisbane River will be completed to a width of 200 feet. When this is effected, the channel will be shown by two Lighthouses, 1,433 yards apart, placed on the Fisherman Islands.

a width of 200 feet. When this a construction of the Pisnerman Islands.

The Lighthouses in line will lead through the cutting, at a distance of 50 feet from the Eastern edge of the channel. Vessels going out will therefore keep the Lighthouses in line, while those entering must keep them open to the Westward when meeting another vessel in the cutting.

By night the lower, or northern leading light will be red.

The Lightship will at the same time be moored outside the Bar; and on the Eastern side of the cutting during the erection of the pile Lighthouse, and from her the tidal signals will be made as usual. She will lie in about 3 fathoms at low water, and all vessels entering the cutting are to pass to the Northward and Westward of her, and thus keep clear of the piles for the pile Lighthouse, which will be placed to the Southward of the Lightship.
