HEREAS by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature, it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia, for the time being, to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; Now THEREFORE I, FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA shall commence and be holden for despatch of business on Wednesday, the eighteenth day of July, 1883, at the hour of THREE o'clock in the AFTER-NOON, in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, within the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you an extract of a letter from the War Office, stating that the Marquis of Hartington is informed that the Civil Service Commissioners will be prepared, upon learning that a person residing in any of the more important distant colonies is desirous of passing the preliminary examination for admission to the Royal College at Sandhurst, to forward to the Governor of the Colony in question a scaled packet of examination papers, with explanations as to the mode of conducting the examination, or should the demand for examination be recurrent, that they would be willing to supply papers beforehand, to be used by the Governor as occasion might require.

This arrangement has superseded a previous one, under which preliminary examinations for Sandhurst would have been conducted in the colonies only by the authorities of Chartered Universities, according to the prescribed regulations, and the extension which the change of system affords enables me to invite your attention to the subject, in case candidates for admission in Western Australia, possessing the necessary qualifications, should wish to avail themselves of the privilege now offered them, by which they would be relieved of the necessity of coming to this country to pass the non-competitive portion of their examination.

I also transmit to you some copies of the regulations for admission to Sandhurst, which contain, among other information, the subjects of examination.

Extract from a letter from the War Office to the Colonial Office, dated 9th March, 1883, No. $\frac{9}{240}$.

I am to observe that a communication has been received from the Civil Service Commissioners, from which it appears that, upon its being notified to them that a person residing in any of the more important distant colonies is desirous of passing, in the Colony, the "preliminary" examination for admission to Sandhurst, they will be prepared to forward to the Governor of the Colony in question a sealed packet of examination papers, accompanied by instructions as to the mode of conducting the examination, or should the demand for examination in the Colony be likely to be recurrent, they would be willing, for the purpose of avoiding delay, to supply the Governor with papers beforehand, to be used by him when the occasion should arise.

This course will accordingly be adopted in preference to the arrangement originally proposed of holding preliminary examinations in the colonies, under the authority of Chartered Colonial Universities.

IS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following Order in Council applying to "The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act," relative to exemption from remeasurement of sailing and steam ships belonging to the United States of America.

AT THE COURT AT WINDSOR, The 19th day of March, 1883. Present,

The Queen's most excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS by the "Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862," it is enacted that, whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships, for the time being in force under the principal Act, have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country, and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry, or other national papers; and, thereupon, it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be remeasured in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions, but such ship shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry, or other papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes in, to, and for which the tonnage, denoted in the certificates of registry of British Ships, is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships.

And whereas it was made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of Merchant Ships, for the time being in force under the principal Act had been, with certain exceptions, adopted by the Government of the United States of America, and Her Majesty by Order in Council dated the 30th day of July, 1868, was pleased to direct that the Merchant Ships of the said United States of America the measurement whereof should, after the 1st of January, 1865, have been ascertained and denoted on the registers, and other national papers of such ships, testified by the dates thereof, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers or other national papers, in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry of British Ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships, after making therefrom the same deductions, in respect of crew space and engine room, as would, if such ships were British, be made from their gross tonnage, under the laws relating to British Ships :

And whereas the Government of the said United States of America have provided that, on and after the 5th day of August, 1882, a deduction from the gross tonnage of every vessel of the United States, shall, on measurement or remeasurement thereof, be made for crew space in sailing ships, and for crew and engine space in steamships :

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that, in consequence of such last recited provision, the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of Merchant Ships, now in force under "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," have been adopted by the Government of the United States of America, with the exception of a difference in the mode in certain steamers, of estimating the allowance for engine room, and such rules are now in force in that country, having come into operation on the 5th day of August, 1882, and that it is desirable that the ships of the said United States, measured or remeasured as aforesaid, on or after the said 5th day of August, 1832, shall, instead of requiring re-measurement in the United Kingdom- for crew space in sailing ships, or for crew and engine space in steam ships, be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers:

NOW, THEREFORE, Her Majesty is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct as follows:---

1. As regards sailing ships; that Merchant Sailing ships of the said United States of America, the measurement whereof after the said 5th day of August, 1882, has been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such sailing ships, testified by the date thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers, and other national papers, in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British sailing ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships.

2. As regards steam ships; that Merchant Ships belonging to the said United States of America, which are propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine room, the measurement whereof shall, after the said 5th day of August, 1882, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such steam ships, testified by the dates thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers or other national papers in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships. Provided, nevertheless, that if the owner or master of any such American Steam Ship desires the deduction for engine room in his ships to be estimated under the rules for engine room measurement and deduction applicable to British Ships, instead of under the American rule, the engine room shall be measured, and the deduction calculated, according to the British rules. York Municipality

AT a meeting of the Council for this Municipality held this fourth day of May, 1883, it was resolved that By-Law No. 14 be amended, that Nos. 18, 22, 23, 24, 27, and 28, gazetted September 30th, 1881, be repealed, and that the following new By-Laws be adopted.

14. Amended by adding as follows: "No fee will be charged for comparing weights, measures, and balances, unless such weights, measures, and balances be taken to the Office of the Inspector by the owner or his agent.'

29. It shall not be lawful for any person to build, within the Municipality, a hay, corn, or straw stack, or to allow any part of a crop of corn or hay, after becoming ripe, to remain nearer than fifty feet to any building, and any person so offending shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

30. Any person wishing to cut, fell, or remove timber, on land belonging to or in charge of the Municipal Council, must pay a license fee of five shillings per month, for each man so to be engaged, to the Collector of the Council, and must have a special sanction in writing from the Council, for cutting, felling, or removing on any road, street, or Any offender against this By-Law right-of-way. will be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

31. Any person riding, leading, or driving cattle or horses on any footpath, or obstructing any thoroughfare by leaving teams standing thereon, or in any other way, within the limits of the Townsite, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

32. No person will be allowed to bathe between the hours of six o'clock a.m. and eight o'clock p.m. so near to any road, path, or thoroughfare in ordinary use as to offend against public decency. Offenders against this By-Law will be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings; except children bathing at a time and place to be named by the Council.

33. Licenses will be issued to residents within the Town, for the run of horned cattle only, upon the York Commonage, or land in charge of the Municipal Council for any number, exclusive of sucking calves, not exceeding six, at the rate of five shillings Licenses will be issued per head per annum. yearly as dating from the first day of January, and half yearly as dating from the first day of July. No License will be issued for less than half a year. Any person keeping unlicensed cattle, or turning loose, or tethering stock of any other kind upon the Commonage, will be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence.
