Forest Timber Lets with frontages on the Eastern Railway, Nos. 5 and 6.

PECIAL Licenses, for a term of fourteen years, to cut and remove the timber now standing on the lots marked and distinguished in the maps and books of the Survey Office as Forest Lots 5 and 6, each containing three square miles, will be re-offered for sale by auction at this Office, on Wednesday, the 18th

The lots will be offered separately, subject to a discretionary right held by the Commissioner of Crown Lands to withdraw either or both of them from sale should the bids (which will be taken as the annual rental to be paid in advance) not reach an anticipated amount.

Special Licenses will be issued to the successful bidders, but will give no right to the soil or to the pasturage, nor to a renewal at the expiration of the term for which issued.

Any person or persons making the bid or bids accepted shall, immediately after the sale, deposit at the Colonial Treasury one half year's rent (to the 31st December next), which will be one half of such bid or bids.

Thenceforward the rent is to be paid in advance on the 1st January in each year, unless such day should be a Sunday or holiday, then on the following day.

Successful bidders may acquire a license for the timber lands immediately adjoining the back of their blocks, at the rate of £20 for each 640 acres. The rental for such being paid in advance at the same time as for the frontage blocks.
