WHEREAS by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature, it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia, for the time being, to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; NOW THEREFORE I, FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA shall commence and be holden for despatch of business on WEDNESDAY, THE EIGHTEENTH DAY OF JULY, 1883, at the hour of THREE o'clock in the AFTER-NOON, in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, within the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

By His Excellency FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS I, the said Governor, do hereby adjudge and declare it probable that an infectious disease dangerous to the health of Her Majesty's subjects, that is to say, Cholera, may be brought from Egypt to Western Australia; Now I do by this Proclamation order that all vessels coming from or having touched at any port or place in Egypt, and all vessels and boats receiving any person, goods, wares, merchandise, packets, packages, baggage, wearing apparel, books, letters, or any other article whatever from or out of any such vessel so coming from or having touched at any such port or place as aforesaid; And all persons, goods, wares, merchandise, packets, packages, baggage, wearing apparel, books, letters, or any other article whatsoever on board of any vessel coming from or having touched at any such port or place as aforesaid, or on board of any such receiving vessel or boat as aforesaid, shall be and shall be considered to be liable to Quarantine within the meaning of "The Quarantine Ordinance, 1868," and of any order or orders which shall be made by me concerning Quarantine and the prevention of infection. AND I DO FURTHER order that all such vessels and boats as aforesaid, and all persons as well pilots as others, and all goods, wares, merchandise, and all other articles as aforesaid, shall upon their arrival at any port or place within the territory of Western Australia aforesaid be obliged to perform Quarantine within the limits of the Quarantine Grounds or Stations now or hereafter to be defined for, in, or near to such ports or places respectively for the period of three days, to be computed from the day of arrival in the said territory inclusive, by avoiding or being kept from all intercourse or communication with any person or place in such port or elsewhere within the said territory.

SUBJECT ALWAYS to the powers given by the said Ordinance to me and to divers other persons of shortening or prolonging the time of Quarantine aforesaid in particular cases, and of releasing particular vessels, persons, and goods from Quarantine.

PROVIDED that if no case of Cholera shall have occurred on board of such vessel since its departure from any Egyptian port or place, and if no communication with any infected vessel, boat, person, or thing shall have taken place since the said departure, the vessel shall not be subjected to Quarantine.

JETTY REGULATION.

42nd Victoria, No. 18.

ADDITIONAL Regulation made by the Governor in Executive Council for the management and use of all Public Jetties at the several Ports of the Colony, in accordance with the provisions of "The Jetties Regulation Act, 1878" :—

I, FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Esq., Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, do, by this Regulation made in pursuance of "The Jetties Regulation Act, 1878," direct and declare as follows, that is to say :—

"No person or persons shall land or place, or cause to be landed or placed upon the Public Jetties at the several Ports of the Colony, or upon the approaches to any such Jetties, any decayed or decaying vegetable matter or other thing whatsoever likely to become a nuisance."
