SIR,—On my last voyage from King Sound to this Port, I passed at a distance of about half a mile a dangerous Reef in King Sound, situated as follows:—The East end of Sunday Island bearing N.N.W., and an Island South of Tree Island (no name) bearing N.E.

The Reef seemed to be about 200 yards long N.N.W. and S.S.E., and about 50 yards wide; the sea was breaking on its outer edges and it was just uncovered, it being at the time at about half spring tides. As this dangerous Reef lies almost in the direct path of vessels entering King Sound by Sunday Strait, I trust you will be pleased to take what steps you may deem necessary to give it the earliest publication.

### APPROACHES TO PORT AUGUSTA.

THE Marine Board hereby give notice that a channel, one mile in length, having a width of 150ft. and a depth of 18ft. low water, ordinary springs, has been cut through the reach leading from Brown's Point towards Port Augusta.

About two cables' length of the southern portion of the reach has been widened to 300ft.

Masters of vessels bound for Port Augusta should leave the red beacons on the starboard hand at a distance of from 75ft. to 100ft.

Small cask buoys painted black will mark the port side of the channel.

MEW LIGHTS AT FOINT ARCHER AND ROCKY ISLET. Notice is hereby given, that on and after this date, two New Lights will be exhibited from Point Archer and Rocky Islet respectively. The former, which stands on the highest part of the point, at an elevation of 220 feet above high water, consists of a 4th order holo-photal condensing apparatus exhibited from a circular tower forty-five feet in height. NEW LIGHTS AT POINT ARCHER AND ROCKY ISLET.

feet in height. The Light is seen from the Southward, from Cape Tribulation round to S. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S., but is intensified on a N. W. by N.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N. bearing, when it is in line with the Light on Rocky Islet. It is obscured between the bearings of S. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. and S. by E. Southerly when it is seen as a Green light until the bears S. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. Between that bearing and S. S. E. it is seen as a White Light, and again as a Red Light from the latter bearing to S. E. by S.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. The apparatus at Rocky Islet is a Holophote, showing a beam of light S. E. by S.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. The Light, so the light is exhibited from a tower 20th high, standing on the Western slope of the Islet, at an elevation of 90 feet above high water. The Lights can be seen at a distance of 20 and 14 miles respectively.

The two Lights in line give nearly a midchannel course between a Beef and Point Thomas. While the Light on Point Archer is visible to the westward of S. W. § S., vessels are clear of c and e Reefs.

The Eastern edge of the Green Sector cuts the Western edge of d Reef

Keer. While in the White Sector vessels are clear of d Reef on the one hand, and the Blackbird Patch on the other. In working to the Southward, after passing Monk-house Point, vessels may stand into Walker Bay as far as the Western edge of the Red Sector, which leads clear of the rocky ground in the Bay.

Red Sector, which leads clear of the rocky ground in the Eay. Directions:--Vessels from the Northward leaving the Endeavor River, will, by night, when steering to the South-enstward, pass through the Red Sector; and those rounding Cape Bedford, and steering for Monk-house Point will pass through the Green Sector, and into the White Sector of the light on Point Archer, steering for it until nearly abreast the Southern end of Walker Bay. They will then cross the Green and obscured Sectors, rounding Walker and Archer Points, and Rocky Islet at a safe distance. After passing the latter, the two lights should be brought into line on a N. W. by N. \ N. bearing, and kept in that position until a Reef is passed. Similarly ressels from the Southwards steering to clear a Beef with

Similarly vessels from the Southwards, steering to clear a Reef with the lights in line, will, after rounding Rocky Islet and passing Walker Point cross the Obscured and Green Sectors, and keep within the White Sector until d Reef and the Blackbird Patch are passed.
