## NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 1st September, 1883.

IIS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following Telegrams, for the information of Mariners:—

Telegram from Governor of Victoria to Governor of Western Australia.

Have received following from Administrator of Queensland, viz:—Have just received following telegram from British Consul at Batavia: "In consequence volcanic action, configuration Sunda Straits and Southern entrance thereto changed. Some islands disappeared; upheavals; suspected Anger with lighthouse destroyed; probably other lighthouses in neighbourhood damaged; survey proceeding; recommend mariners exercise extreme caution."

Telegram from Colonial Secretary, Singapore, to Colonial Secretary, Western Australia. Volcanic eruptions Sunda Straits. Charts quite unreliable. Lights destroyed.

Telegram from Consul General, Netherlands, Melbourne, to Colonial Secretary, Western Australia.

Received the following telegram from the Admiral, Batavia:—"Strong volcanic eruptions in Sund Straits. Charts not to be trusted at all. All lights destroyed."
