## PROCLAMATION

Western Australia, }

By His Excellency FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS it is provided by "The Sandalwood Act, 1881," that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim and define one or more area or areas of Waste Lands of the Crown within which no live or growing sandalwood tree shall be cut or grubbed up for the period to be named by the Governor in such proclamation :

NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and define the Waste Lands of the Crown contained and being within the following areas to be areas within which no live or growing Sandalwood tree shall be cut or grubbed up during the period of three years from the date hereof.

1. *Plantagenet and Williams Districts.*—All the land contained within lines starting from a spot about ten miles North from Mullidup on the Pal-linup River, and extending in a North-westerly direction passing along the Eastern sides of "Coyre-up" and "Dumbleyung" Lakes produced to a spot on the Eastern boundary of the Reserve described in the *Government Gazette* of the sixteenth day of January, 1883; from thence in a Southerly direction along the Eastern boundary aforesaid to Lake Norring; from thence by a West by South line to Beaufort Bridge on the Perth-Albany Road; from thence by the road aforesaid towards Albany to Gordon Bridge; and from thence by the Gordon River upwards to Etakup, and from thence to the starting point.

2. *Victoria District.*—Bounded on the South by a line fifty miles in length extending East from the sea coast from a point fifty miles South from Dongarra; on the Eastward by lines extending Northward

from the East end of the South boundary to a spot fifty miles East from Dongarra; from thence in a North-westerly direction through a spot situate fifty miles East from Geraldton to Pelican Pool in the Murchison River; from thence by the said river downwards to the sea coast, and by the sea coast in a Southerly direction to the starting point.

Given under my hand and issued under the Public Seal of the said Colony, this 28th day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

### NOTICE TO MARINERS, PILOTS, AND OTHERS.

#### SOUTH AUSTRALIA.

[No. 6 of 1883.]

#### GULF OF ST. VINCENT.

#### PORT ADELAIDE RIVER.

**N**OTICE is hereby given that deepening operations have so far progressed in the channel leading from the sea to Port Adelaide that, on and after the 1st August next, a depth of not less than 18ft. at low water spring tides will be found.

The first cutting through what is known as the Inner Bar commences nearly opposite No. 10 light beacon; it is 100ft. wide until reaching No. 9 light beacon, where a dredger is now at work widening it to 150ft.; thence to the powder magazine the width is 150ft. At the approach to and round the curve at Snapper Point the width is nearly 250ft.

A mid-channel course from the magazine will lead into the newly-formed cutting, commencing nearly opposite No. 2 light beacon; it is 150ft. wide until reaching what is known as the red buoy creek. The cuttings to this point are marked in the usual manner, viz:—red buoys on the starboard hand and black buoys on the port hand coming in. From the red buoy creek to the South Australian Company's dock entrance the channel is nearly 300ft. wide, having a depth of not less than 21ft. at low water.

It is recommended that large or heavy draught ships should not come in until the tidal signals exhibited from the Semaphore station show at least 1ft. above the vessel's draught.

### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

#### SOUTH-EAST COAST OF NEW GUINEA.

**T**HE following information respecting the navigation of the S.E. coast of New Guinea has been furnished by Mr. H. J. Liljebland, master of the London Missionary steamer "Ellengowan."

A dangerous reef, with less than 9 feet of water over it and with sharp coral rocks, lies 4 miles E.S.E. from the north point of Bampton Island.

A clear passage (Missionary Passage) with not less than 4½ fathoms at low-water springs, runs to the northward of the Great Warrior Reef, Tauan Island (Mount Cornwallis) bearing W.S.W.

A sunken reef, with not more than two fathoms over it at low-water springs, lies in Caution Bay, 4 miles S. ½ E. from Redscar Head.

A clear passage through the Barrier, 1½ miles wide, with not less than 4½ fathoms at low-water springs, lies with Lily Island bearing east.

Between Round Head and the Barrier Reef, in the neighbourhood of Round Head Entrance, are numerous sunken reefs, the ground not being navigable for vessels drawing more than 13 feet.

A clear passage through the Barrier (Ellengowan Entrance), one cable in width, and with a depth of 16 fathoms, lies with Round Head bearing N.N.W.

Another, but not very clear passage through the barrier, lies with Coutance Island bearing W.N.W., distant about 1 mile; and a passage (Sunday Passage) at a distance of about 4 miles from the island, two conspicuous marks on the side of a hill on the mainland bearing N.N.E. ½ E.

There is a clear passage through the Barrier on the West side of Grange Island—off which a reef extends some two miles to the S.E.—and another passage to the eastward of this reef.

A sunken coral reef (Kidd Reef), plainly visible, and with but little water over it, lies with Table Point bearing N.W. by W. ½ W., distant 2 miles.

There is a good anchorage inside the Leocadie Islands, in not less than 8 fathoms, mud, with an entrance from either side.

Nothing less than 20 fathoms was found in the position assigned to Heath's Reefs, and no danger was seen there except the reefs fringing the shore.

### Regulations for the Management of the Fremantle Imperial Pauper Invalid Depot.

1. The Surgeon of Fremantle Prison to have general control and supervision of the Depôt, under instructions from His Excellency the Governor conveyed through the officer administering the Convict Department; and the undermentioned assistants are placed under his authority, for the management of the establishment:—

- 1 Warder in Charge.
- 3 Prisoners as Orderlies.

2. The Warder in Charge will, under the general authority of the Surgeon of the Depôt, carry out such instructions as he may receive, and be held responsible that the rules are strictly adhered to in every respect.

It will be his special duty to muster the paupers at the hours named; to see that the paupers are orderly and decent in behaviour; that they attend to the rules in regard to cleanliness and ventilation; that their meals are properly served, and that no idleness exists among those able to work.

He must not fail to report to the Surgeon any irregularity that occurs in the Depôt.

3. The prisoner who is acting as cook is to keep the cook-house and all the utensils clean and in good order, and to have the different meals properly prepared and served out at the specified times.

4. Paupers admitted into the Depôt are to be taken on arrival to the bath-house, and made clean with soap and water. The hair to be cut, if necessary. They are then to be supplied with the regulated depôt clothing.

5. A ticket with the name, date of reception, religion, and cause of admission of each pauper is to be hung at the foot of his bed.

6. Paupers suffering from infectious diseases to be, as far as practicable, kept separate from the other inmates.

7. All paupers, with the exception of those who are bed-ridden, are to rise in Summer at 5:30 o'clock in the morning, and in Winter at 6 o'clock.

The apartments are to be freely ventilated, the bedding well shaken and exposed to the air, and the beds are to be kept clean, and neatly made up by half-past 7 o'clock; and the Warder in Charge is to tell off as many as may be required to assist the prisoner orderlies to carry out these duties, and see that all apartments are cleaned out every morning, and oftener if required, and the floors washed when

necessary; and the Warder in Charge is to see that all paupers wash and clean themselves every morning before breakfast.

8. The men are to be mustered, and the roll called at 7-30 a.m. before breakfast, and at noon before dinner; and again in the evening after supper.

Breakfast to be at 7-30 a.m.; dinner at noon; and supper at half-past 4 o'clock in Winter, and half-past 5 in Summer.

9. The diet as far as practicable to be in conformity with the subjoined table, as to the species and quantity of food; and the strictest economy is to be exercised in ordinary extras such as tobacco, wine, brandy, or malt liquors:—

10. One hour to be allowed for each meal, viz.:— From half-past 7 o'clock, a.m., to half-past 8 o'clock, and from noon to one o'clock, p.m.

11. All paupers who are considered by the Surgeon fit for work are to be employed from 9 o'clock until noon; they again return to their work at one o'clock, and continue at their different occupations until 4 o'clock in Winter, and 5 o'clock in Summer.

The men are to be employed under the direction of the Warder in Charge, some breaking stones, others working in the garden; and if there be any tradesmen among them, as a tailor or a shoemaker, then one is to be employed mending clothes, the other repairing or making shoes. All who are able to do any work are to be kept occupied during working hours.

12. All the paupers are to be orderly and submissive in their behaviour, and to comply with every regulation of the Depot.

13. Swearing, insulting words or behaviour, drunkenness, introduction of intoxicating liquors, indecent conversation, and every species of gambling are strictly prohibited.

14. Wilful destruction of either private or Government clothing and property will subject the offender to severe punishment.

15. Paupers wilfully transgressing any of the regulations of the establishment render themselves liable to be punished.

16. No visitors to be allowed access to the inmates without the sanction of the Surgeon or the Officer in Charge.

17. Ministers of religion are to be allowed to visit paupers daily. In extreme cases, when the desire is expressed to have the assistance of a clergyman, the Warder in Charge is at once to have such desire conveyed to the proper person.

18. Nopauper is to go beyond the limits of the Depot grounds without the written permission of the Surgeon & the Warder in Charge.
