Timber Licenses for Special Area on the Darling Range.

pleased to order and direct, in virtue of the powers vested in him, that all that portion of Crown Land situate in the Swan District, and bounded on the Westward by the Western face of the Darling Range; on the Northward by the Newcastle Road; on the Eastward by Worriloo Brook, and by a line running South from near where the said Brook crosses the Northam Road to the Helena River; and on the South by the Helena River—shall be subject, in so far as the felling, cutting, splitting, and removing of timber is concerned, to the following Regulations.

Within the above defined area a block of 3 square miles will be retained by the Crown specially for the use of persons engaged cutting up timber by hand, commonly known as "Pit Sawyers."

REGULATIONS.

- 1. Applications will be received at the Crown Lands' Office for special licenses to cut over timber forest lots fronting on the railway or otherwise. Lots fronting on the railway shall have a mean breadth of one mile or thereabouts, and a mean depth of three miles or thereabouts. Upon approval of an application, the lot comprised therein will be offered by Public Auction.
 - 2. The conditions of sale shall be:-
 - (a) An upset rent of £100 per annum, for a term of 14 years for each lot.
 - (b) The Crown to reserve the right to reserve or sell any portion not exceeding one sixth of the area let, on giving two months notice of the the intention so to do; and further to reserve the right to reserve or sell the whole or any portion beyond the one-sixth before stated, on giving twelve months notice of the intention so to do; provided, however, that such notice shall be in writing, and that during the said terms of two months or twelve months the licensee shall be at liberty to remove the timber from the land to be reserved or sold.

- 3. Applications for licenses, under Clause 110 of the Land Regulations, for permission to fell, cut, split, and remove timber from Crown Lands within the beforenamed area, upon land not included in any reserve, or in any special license, shall only be received at the Crown Lands Office, Perth, and shall be subject to the following conditions:—
 - (a) All logs felled shall be cut across into one or more lengths, and not merely felled and left with the top and branches on.
 - (b) All logs so cut across shall be removed to the mill, or to a platform alongside the Railway, or, in the event of the person felling being a person engaged "Pit sawing," to his sawpit, within one month from the date of felling.
 - (c) Any breach of the above regulations, besides being punishable under Act 36 Vic. No. 8, shall also render the license of the offender, together with any timber remaining unremoved, liable to forfeiture; and a renewal of the license shall not be granted except on the special approval of the Governor.
- 4. Present holders of licenses to cut timber on Waste Crown Lands, issued under Clause 110 of the Land Regulations, shall be permitted, upon application, to cut within the area to which these regulations apply; but subject, nevertheless, to the foregoing conditions and regulations.
- 5. The Land Regulations of the 11th October, 1882, shall be held to apply to the beforementioned area, in so far as the said Regulations are not inconsistent with the present Regulations.

N pursuance of instructions contained in a Circular Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, dated the 17th August, 1873. His Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following rule for the guidance of officers in the Civil Service of the Colony who may obtain leave of absence; viz.:—

"Any officer who may desire to forego a portion of his leave should obtain the previous permission of the Governor; or, if in Europe, should apply to the Secretary of State for permission to do so in sufficient time to allow of at least one clear month's notice being given to the Governor should the Secretary of State approve; and that on his arrival in the Colony it shall be understood that he cannot claim as a right to resume his own appointment before the expiration of his original leave, but must place himself at the order of the Governor, who will make such arrangements for his re-employment, and for his eventual resumption of the duties of his office, as may be found possible."

IS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following amended By-Laws passed by the Pinjarrah Commonage Board, and which have been approved by His Excellency the Governor.

The following are the By-Laws adopted by the Pinjarrah Commonage Board.

1. That 1s. (one shilling) per head for cattle and horses, and 3d. (threepence) per head for sheep, shall be levied upon every stockowner whose lands are adjacent to the Pinjarrah Commonage and whose stock are depastured thereon in the month of January of each year, and the same shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Commonage Board.

2. That during the month of January in each year, it shall be compulsory for every stockowner as aforesaid to give a correct number of such cattle, horses, and sheep, and the Chairman of the Board will furnish such owner of stock with a certificate showing the number and description of the same.

3. That no stock, except that which is the property of persons whose lands are adjacent to the Commonage, shall be allowed on the Commonage.

4. That no sheep, except for killing purposes, shall be depastured on the Commonage, and such sheep being the property of one person shall not exceed 30 (thirty) in number; any person depasturing more than that number shall be liable to a fine of 2s. 6d. (two shillings and sixpence) per head for every sheep beyond that number.

5. That the full amount of taxes levied as aforesaid shall be paid on or before the 1st of March ensuing. All arrears of such taxes remaining unpaid after that date shall be sued for by the Chairman of Pinjarrah "Commonage" in the Local Court of the

district, and upon judgment for the plaintiff such stock will be liable to be seized and sold by order of the Court to defray expenses.

6. That a penalty not exceeding £2 (two pounds), exclusive of costs, shall be imposed upon all stock-owners for non-compliance with these Rules, to be recovered summarily according to the provisions of the law. Also the full fees as stated in By-Law No. 1 will be recovered as aforesaid.

7. That the fees and fines be appropriated and expended by the Commonage Board in the drainage and otherwise in improving the streets upon the townsite of Pinjarrah.

8. That all stray cattle found trespassing on the Pinjarrah Commonage will be dealt with as the law directs

9. That it shall be competent for any member of the Commonage Board to sue for trespass or otherwise.

Injuries to Buoys, Beacons, and Sea-marks.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 22nd October, 1883.

HEREAS by "The Shipping and Pilotage Consolidation Ordinance, 1855," it is enacted that any person who shall wilfully injure or remove any buoy, beacon, or sea-mark used for the convenience of navigation or security of shipping shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding fifty pounds.

And whereas on or about Saturday, the 29th of September last, the buoy marking the Hall Bank, within the harbor of Fremantle, disappeared, and there is good reason for believing that some person or persons did wilfully injure the said buoy so as to cause it to sink: Notice is hereby given that a reward of £10 will be given to any one who shall give such information to the police authorities at Fremantle, or elsewhere, as will lead to the conviction of the said offender or offenders.

And notice is hereby further given that all offenders against the said Ordinance will be prosecuted according to law.

FROM THE GERALDTON MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

To His Excellency Frederick Napier Broome, Esq., C.M.G., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and for the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies.

SIR.

We, the Chairman and Councillors of the Municipality of Geraldton and inhabitants of the Victoria District, desire to approach Your Excellency with expressions of loyalty to Her Majesty the Queen, and of hearty welcome to yourself, on the occasion of your first visit to the Victoria District.

We thank you for having arranged that visit so soon after your assumption of the Government, and we desire to extend our thanks and welcome to Lady Barker, who so kindly accompanies you.

Your Excellency happily comes amongst us at a time when gloomy anticipations are giving place to hope. A succession of dry seasons, culminating, in the year 1881, in a severe drought, has materially retarded the progress of this part of the Colony; but, by God's blessing, a change for the better has taken place, the last and present seasons having been all that could be desired both for agricultural and pastoral pursuits.

Coming here by sea, Your Excellency will have observed what great natural advantages Champion Bay possesses as a port for shipping, and how much it needs improved jetty accommodation that those advantages may be thoroughly utilised.

We are glad that Your Excellency proposes to return to Perth overland. The journey will take you through that extensive agricultural district about to be surveyed in connection with proposals for a Geraldton-Irwin Railway. We are confident that the result of the journey will be to secure for that Railway scheme Your Excellency's hearty approval and support.

A few years ago there was every reason to look forward to a great future for the important mining district of Northampton. Our hopes in this respect have been hitherto frustrated by a great and long continued depression in the lead market; but we believe that much might be done for the development of our mineral resources by the establishment of local smelting works, to the erection of which, we doubt not, Your Excellency will afford every encouragement in your power.

We believe that the more a Governor makes himself personally acquainted with the Colony over which he is called to rule, the better will he be able to administer the Government to the satisfaction both of himself and of the inhabitants; and we hail Your Excellency's early visit as evincing a determination to form your judgment of the wants of the Colony from your own knowledge of its various districts.

We trust that your stay here will prove as pleasant to Your Excellency and Lady Barker as it is welcome to us all, and that it will only be the first of many visits helping to bind us all together in common efforts for the welfare of the Colony and in love and loyalty to the Empire and the Throne.

REPLY.

GENTLEMEN,-

The Address which you have just presented to me begins and ends with expressions of that allegiance to our beloved Queen which is the breath and air of the national life of Englishmen, and which must ever be the first and the last feeling present to those who, at Geraldton or elsewhere in this most loyal Colony, assemble to greet Her Majesty's Representative.

The extremely kind manner in which you welcome Lady Barker and myself on this our first visit to Champion Bay is very pleasant and gratifying to us both. We have been looking forward with much interest to our stay in Geraldton and our tour through the Victoria district, and we are glad to find ourselves amongst you.

During successive years, the inhabitants of this district have struggled bravely against reverses. The better fortune to which you are now happily able to call my attention is doubtless due to more favorable seasons; but it is also the sequel of much patient and persevering toil. It has been well earned, and I trust it may be permanent.

The local knowledge of the district, and the personal acquaintance with its people, which I hope to gain during my stay amongst you, will be of great value to me.

You refer to the improvement of your Port and of your inland communications. The improvement of the Geraldton jetty is now in progress. The Irwin Railway will shortly be a surveyed line; and, in a progressing Colony, a railway which has been surveyed soon becomes a railway in course of construction. I trust that the reward offered from the public funds for the establishment of local smelting works may before long have a practical result; and that the magnificent lodes of your lead mines may thus recover some of their former value.

Western Australia, gentlemen, appears to be emerging from "the day of small things." It behoves us to be prudent in our new prosperity, and not overbold in our prophecies of the future. But I

think that the larger scope which the aspirations of the people and the undertakings of the Government have lately assumed, is warranted; and, so long as we can advance on firm ground, I, for one, will not sound a retreat

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY,-

We, the settlers of the Greenough District, while thanking Your Excellency for having taken so early an opportunity of visiting this portion of the vast territory over the destinies of which you have been called upon to preside, beg to tender to yourself and to Lady Barker our most cordial welcome, and to express our gratification at receiving you amongst us.

FROM THE IRWIN DISTRICT ROADS BOARD.

To His Excellency F. Napier Broome, Esq., Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY,-

On behalf of the inhabitants of the Irwin District, we beg to express the great pleasure we feel in giving a cordial and sincere welcome to Your Excellency and Lady Barker, on this your first visit to this part of the Colony.

Although we live a comparatively secluded life, far removed from the chief centres of population, we are not behind our fellow colonists in loyalty to the throne and person of our gracious Queen, nor in sentiments of regard and esteem for Your Excellency personally, to whom has been committed the honorable and responsible task of administering the Government of this, the largest of the Australian Colonies.

In common with our fellow colonists, we participate in the well assured expectation that under the guidance of Your Excellency the province of Western Australia is about to enter upon a new era of progress and prosperity, and we entertain the hope that the Irwin District may be privileged to share in that brighter future that we believe will soon dawn upon the land of our birth or of our adoption.

Your Excellency in visiting this district will perceive that it possesses resources yet to be developed and a large extent of land yet to be reclaimed from nature, and which is suitable for pastoral and especially for agricultural operations. The hinderance in the way of improvement, hitherto, has been the difficulty in the transit of produce to a market or to a seaport for exportation.

We think this difficulty may be overcome by the adoption of one of two alternative undertakings: the first the construction of a railway from Geraldton to Dongarra, and terminating at some point on the Upper Irwin, the alternative—which would also secure for this district many advantages—the extension of jetty accommodation in our harbor, and the periodical visits of one of the steamers that now sail along our coast. We would respectfully suggest to Your Excellency the desirability of obtaining such

statistical information from the settlers on these subjects that may, after due consideration, lead to a practical solution of the question.

We are glad that Your Excellency's visit occurs at a season when our fields put on their most verdant appearance, and give the promise that with the Divine blessing we may reap in due time a bountiful harvest.

We trust that Your Excellency's sojourn in this part of the Colony may be one of unalloyed enjoyment; that it may conduce to the health of yourself and Lady Barker; and that at no distant period we may again have the pleasure of welcoming you to our district.

THE DOG ACT, 1883.

REWARDS FOR DESTRUCTION OF WILD DOGS.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 22nd October, 1883.

IS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, for the information of Magistrates, Justices of the Peace, and the public generally, that although "The Dog Act" does not come into force until the 1st day of January, 1884, the Government are prepared, at once, to offer rewards for the destruction of Wild Dogs in the terms of the Act; that is to say:—

47 VICT., No. XIII.

Section 19:—"If any person shall produce to any Justice of the Peace the tail of a dog, and shall prove to the satisfaction of such Justice that it is the tail of a wild dog, he shall be entitled, if such dog has been destroyed within the Central District, to a reward of Ten shillings, and if such dog has been destroyed in any district other than the Central District, he shall be entitled to a reward of Five shillings, to be obtained as hereinafter mentioned. The said Justice shall forthwith cause the said tail to be entirely destroyed in his presence, and he shall give to the said person a certificate in writing signed by the said Justice and certifying that the whole tail of a wild dog has been produced to him by the said person and has been entirely destroyed in his presence and that the said person is entitled to such a sum as aforesaid as a reward for the destruction of a wild dog."

Section 20:—"Upon the production of such certificate as aforesaid to the Clerk of the Court of any Petty Sessions or

of any Resident Magistrate, Government Resident, or Police Magistrate, such person shall be paid by such Clerk the sum named in the said Certificate, and the Clerk shall retain the said certificate and deal with it as hereinbefore provided for."

THE DOG ACT, 1883.

REGISTRATION OF DOGS.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 22nd October, 1883.

IS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of Section 6 of "The Dog Act, 1883," which comes into operation on the first day of January next, and reads as follows:—

Section 6:—"On or before the first day of November in each year every Municipal Council, and the Justices of every Court of Petty Sessions shall give notice, by publishing the same in a newspaper circulating in their district, and by posting up the same in some conspicuous place in the said district, of the persons appointed by such Municipal Council or Court of Petty Sessions as the case may be, to carry out the provisions of this Act, so far as relates to the duties imposed on such persons."

The attention of Municipal Councils and Justices of Courts of Petty Sessions is requested to the above.
